

OCTOBER 26, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of meeting of October 12 read and approved.
3. Ald. David heard in regard to the city and county participating in the construction of a new library. After discussion, Ald. David moved to proceed and have an architect draw plans, Ald. Norton seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
4. Mrs. Ross Holland and Mr. David Reeves told council of auto accidents on Hunt Drive which they claim were due to a hole left in the road by a city crew that had made a water tap at the Geo. Cox apartment house. Mrs. Holland said she was under the care of a doctor for back injuries suffered in the accident and Mr. Reeves said the damage to his car was estimated at \$194.00. Council advised both to file damage claims with the city at the Nov. 9 meeting of City Council.
5. Mr. C. H. Dellinger and Mr. Joe Turk requested the city to open a street between Richards and Oak Sts. Supt. Owens to meet Mr. Dellinger on Tues., Oct. 27 and investigate the matter.
6. After turning over to the clerk a petition from residents in the area objecting to the issuance of a malt beverage license to Mr. W. A. Prater dba Gem Cafe, Ald. King gave the clerk his reasons (in writing) for opposing this license and made a motion that Mr. Prater's application be denied. Ald. Norton seconded the motion and the Request was denied by the Council.
7. The application for a malt beverage license by Mr. George Avery was read. (Mr. Avery requested a package license only.)
8. Ald. David heard in regard to the Chattam house which burned on city property. Ald. King said the fire was under investigation and he felt it would be best not to discuss it further.
9. Ald. David brought the airport up for discussion saying that about 60 acres of Mr. Raymond King's property would be needed as well as several acres of Mr. Columbus Shirley's land. Ald. King moved to proceed with the preliminary survey upon receipt of the county's half of the cost of same. Mr. David seconded the motion which was voted on and passed.
10. Petitions requesting annexation of property were read and the following property accepted: Mrs. J. E. Miller, 110 Victory Drive, Drs. Bill Purcell and Bill Thompson, Memorial Drive and Edwards St. and Mr. J. C. Kay on U. S. 41 N. This was on a motion by Ald. David, seconded by Ald. Norton and passed.
11. Mr. J. C. Kay's application for a malt beverage license at the U. S. 41 N. location read and to be acted on at Nov. 9 meeting.
12. Ald. David said the Calhoun Quarterback Club had agreed to buy poles and additional lights to improve the lighting of the football field if the city would install these and furnish the transformers. Ald. David moved to do this, Ald. King seconded and the motion passed.
13. Ald. David said Miss. Tilla Rooker had complained that her taxes were too high. Council said the county had raised her tax assessment and the city had used the county's figure and would not change it unless and until the county did.
14. Supt. Owens reported that the street sweeper should be replaced. Council told Mr. Owens to look into this.
15. Supt. Owens told Council that Mr. Durham Richards was now working for the city on a part time basis, keeping his equipment in the city barn and charging the city \$3.00 per hour for the time he worked on city equipment.
16. Supt. Owens announced that the sewage main to the old armory had been installed.
17. Council said the funds for Christmas decorations had been

used and that they were sorry they could not help the Ministerial Assn. this year with their live manger scene.

18. Clerk read letter from Greater Chattanooga C of C telling of their plans to visit Calhoun on Oct. 27.

19. Letter from Pres. John Yarbrough of the Ga. Municipal Assn. read. Council complied ~~with~~ the request and adoped a "Get Out the Vote" resolution on motion of Ald. Norton and Second of Ald. Woods.

20. The Lex Jolley Co. proposal on retiring anticipated water & sewage bonds was studied.

21. Ald. King moved to adjourn, Ald. David seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned after motion was passed.
