

JULY 27, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL-ALL PRESENT EX-  
CEPT ALDERMAN W. R. NORTON

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of July 13 meeting read and approved.
3. Mr. Hoyt Gladney complained that the street cut by Mr. Jack Hughey had changed the flow of surface water and would soon damage his property if not corrected. Supt. Owens said he didn't believe Mr. Gladney's property would be damaged due to this.
4. Mr. Henry Cagle, representing the C & H Tufting Corporation just north of the city limits, told council of his firm's problem with Mr. Jack Knight. Mr. Knight has advised C & H that he will seek to enjoin the company from dumping waste water into the creek that crosses his property. Council assured Mr. Cagle of its concern and requested to be advised of future developments.
5. Mr. James Thrash, of Cable Television, presented a plan to install a community television tower. If given a franchise, the company would erect a tower of some 250 feet in height and run a cable attached to city and Southern Bell utility poles and sell subscriptions to residents on a monthly basis. Council to decide at August 10 meeting.
6. Ald. David heard in regard to water main being extended to Regent Mills on Industrial Blvd. Supt. Owens said a 10" main would be extended to the mill.
7. Ald. David said College St. should be widened immediately north of its intersection with Nelson St.
8. Ald. Woods heard in regard to joint use of utility poles by the City and Southern Bell. Mr. Woods read a letter from Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell in which Mr. Bell expressed his fear that the telephone company might get in a position to dictate use of these poles to the city. Council is on record as being opposed to entering into a written contract with Southern Bell.
9. Ald. Woods made a motion to pay the water plant operators on six holidays annually as policemen and firemen are paid. The motion seconded by Ald. King and passed.
10. Ald. Woods moved to accept the offer of the Georgia Power Co. for their electric distribution system in Echota Village; the amount being \$20,043.30. Ald. King seconded this motion, which was passed unanimously.
11. Ald. Woods made a motion that the city's calendar and fiscal years run concurrently beginning Jan. 1, 1965. This motion seconded by Ald. King and passed.
12. Supt. Owens gave the council a report on the budget.
13. Ald. King moved that Mrs. Roy Rabb and Messrs. James Tamplin and Thurman Roberts be appointed as tax assessors for the city. Ald. Woods seconded the motion which was voted and passed.
14. Supt. Owens reported that the 8" water main to Resaca and the 12" sanitary sewer to Pine St. had been installed.
15. Ald. King moved to adjourn, Ald. David seconded and the meeting was declared adjourned by Mayor Dickinson.
