


Sept. 28, 1964 - Regular Meeting of City Council with all present.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer.
2. Minutes of Sept. 14 read and approved.
3. Ald. Norton said autos should be kept off sidewalks and the police should pay special attention to this on Sundays. Chief Roberts said he would take care of the matter.
4. Ald. King reported that Claude Jones was alleged to have murdered his wife.
5. Ald. David said Dr. J. E. Billings had requested that a dead tree on his property on N. Wall St. be cut.
6. Ald. David heard regarding repairs needed at the Woman's Club building which is the Calhoun-Gordon Co. Library.
7. Ald. David said the school board had asked the city to pave a driveway to the old armory building from the street.
8. Supt. Owens reported that the State Highway Dept. recommended that no traffic light be erected at Peters St. and S. Wall St., but they did advise that curbs be installed. Council instructed Supt. Owens to ascertain cost of curbing.
9. Supt. Owens reminded Council of Pine St. Railroad crossing. No action taken.
10. Chief Roberts advised Council that trains were blocking downtown crossings for long periods of time. Council told the chief to have the City Attorney write the L & N RR Co. and request action.
11. Supt. Owens said an additional cost of \$4,000 to bore and case for water main on S-1800 was now necessary. Council decided to postpone this project.
12. Supt. Owens informed Council that Mr. Frank Stephens was seeking a right of way through city property for a planned subdivision between Dew's Pond and Red Bud Rds. No action.
13. The application of Mr. W. A. Prater dba Gem Cafe, for a malt beverage license was read and given to the license committee for action at the Oct. 12 meeting.
14. Council gave the go ahead to Lex Jolley & Co. to ready figures for the proposed sewage treatment plant and mains.
15. Ald. David announced that he and several others from Gordon Co. would attend the Civil Defense Radiological Monitors Instructors school at Dalton on Oct. 5-6-7-8.
16. Ald. Norton moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. Woods and done.
