

JUNE 22, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.


1. Mayor Dickinson announced that he had appointed A. H. Scoggins to the Housing Authority to succeed himself. Council concurred.
2. Council discussed extension of water main from Dew's Pond Road a distance of .3^m to serve Jack McEntire and Bill Spink. They agree to pay half the cost of 2" pipe necessary plus the usual tap fee. Turned over to Ald. J. T. Woods, Jr., chairman of the water and light committee for action.
3. The hazard created by motor scooters, motor bikes, etc. was discussed and it was decided to have Police Chief Roberts advise, thru the local papers, parents of their responsibility and urge them to exercise control over their children in the use of these vehicles.
4. City Board of Education was represented by Chairman Paul Shoffner, board members Bill Mathews, James Tamplin, Supt. Gus Cate and maintenance supt. Frank Burnette. These gentlemen presented plans for the building of a new elementary school (with state funds) and renovation and re-modeling of existing facilities and requested the council to call for a general obligation bond referendum in the amount of \$150,000.00 to finance this program. Ald. Norton moved that this be done, Ald. Woods seconded the motion and it passed without a dissenting vote. The city clerk, city attorney, and city supt. were instructed (in absentia-they being in attendance at the GMA convention in Atlanta) to make necessary preparations for the bond referendum.
5. Ald. Norton made a motion to adjourn which was seconded by Ald. Woods and so ordered by Mayor Dickinson.
