


NOVEMBER 23, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT EXCEPT ALD. KING.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Oct. 26 meeting were read and approved.
3. Ald. Woods said he thought the city should make some arrangements with the Town of Plainville with regard to use of city water in fighting fires. Council asked Mr. Woods and Supt. Owens to meet with Mayor Clyde York of Plainville and work out an agreement.
4. Ald. Norton heard in regard to Christmas decorations at Gordon Hills Shopping Center. After discussion, council agreed that since this was private property, the only decorations authorized were lights across Peters St. at the entrance to the shopping center.
5. Ald. Norton said cars were still parking on the sidewalk on Wall St. and he requested the police department to see that this practice was stopped.
6. Ald. David told council something should be done about parking on Piedmont street at the back of the bank. He said the bank would grass the area if parking was to be eliminated there.
7. Ald. David requested 12 minute limit parking meters be installed in front (on Wall St.) of bank. Supt. Owens to order these meters.
8. Ald. David heard re parking of trucks on Oothcaloga St. at Ojay Mills. Council instructed Supt. Owens to meet with Mr. Bill Spink of Ojay and assist him in laying off parking places in the company lot so that cars now parking in front of the plant may use the lot, thereby enabling trucks to park off the street.
9. Ald. David heard in the matter of acquiring an option on the C. A. Shirley property for the airport. OK'd by council.
10. Supt. Owens told council, after the proposed sewer service charge had been discussed, that Mr. Bill Greene of Wiedeman-Singleton would be present for the Dec. 14 meeting. Council decided to await Mr. Greene's appearance before setting the rates.
11. Supt. Owens reported that the Hunt Subdivision sewer main had progressed to the property of Mr. Norman Long and that he had not been able to negotiate with Mr. Long. Council instructed Mr. Owens to halt the project at Mr. Long's property line until some satisfactory agreement could be reached.
12. Supt. Owens said occupants of the Civic Center had requested that a janitor be employed. Council told Mr. Owens to see Mrs. Edna Langford, chairman of the Recreation Commission, and try to resolve the matter.
13. Ald. Norton advised that garbage was being dumped at Chandler Cemetery and council ordered a chain placed over the entrance to the cemetery.
14. On motion of Ald. David and Second of Ald. Woods, council voted to give city employees the same bonus for Christmas as last year, and at the request of the clerk agreed to pay this on Dec. 5 with regular payroll.
15. Ald. Norton moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. David and done.
