

JULY 13, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer.
2. Minutes of June 8 and June 22 meetings were read and approved.
3. City School Supt. G. V. Cate told council he would prefer to receive school money quarterly. Clerk instructed to make these payments quarterly in the future.
4. F. B. Shepherd and F. J. Richardson presented a petition requesting council to extend water main on Old Fairmount Rd. (\$50 tap, \$4 minimum, 21 customers) Council advised these gentlemen that it would probably be next spring before the main could be installed, but the petition would be placed on file and the City Supt. would check it out to see if it would be profitable.
5. Ald. King made motion to buy 100 new Park-O-Meter parking meters at \$58.00 less \$9.00 each for old meters or a total of \$4900. Ald. Norton seconded the motion which was voted on and passed. It was agreed to pay 50% of each month's receipts until paid in full.
6. Ald. Woods heard in regard to method of charging Mr. T. W. Burger for water at his trailer park at Resaca. Meter reader to continue to count trailers and charge one minimum for each trailer.
7. Ald. Woods motion to limit parking to two hours on both sides of W. Line St. from L & N Railroad to city limits was seconded by Ald. King and passed. Supt. Owens to order and install appropriate signs.
8. Ald. David heard in the matter of requiring fencing of private swimming pools. City Attny. J. C. Maddox said it was his opinion that there was a state law to cover this.
9. Ald. David said the airport committee had given up the proposed site and had, with state and federal officials, investigate four additional locations. Council agreed for Mr. David to continue the search for a suitable site on a no cost to city basis.
10. Supt. Owens told council that the state health department had complained about lint in the large drainage ditch near Buford Textile. He said this ditch had been cleaned and with Buford agreeing to keep lint out, he believed the health dept. would be satisfied.
11. Supt. Owens said the city needed to replace two pick-ups and one dump truck and was instructed to ask for bids on same.
12. Ald. David made motion that city pay gas bill of \$81.19 for National Guard; Ald. King seconded; voted on and passed.
13. Ald. David moved to adjourn this meeting, Ald. King seconded the motion and Mayor Dickinson so ordered.
