

AUGUST 10, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of July 27 meeting read and approved.
3. Mr. James Thrash asked and received council's approval to conduct a survey to determine the feasibility of introducing cable television to the community.
4. Supt. Owens advised council that the L & N Railroad wanted \$4,970.00 for the proposed Oak St. crossing. Action postponed until August 24 meeting.
5. Ald. King moved the repeal of a prior ordinance pertaining to parking on Line St. and made a motion to allow parking on the North side of Line St. from River St. East to driveway of the first house. Ald. David seconded the motion which was voted and passed.
6. Council instructed Supt. Owens to turn off caution light at Trammell and N. Wall Sts.
7. Supt. Owens told council that he had to have more men if he was to complete work already scheduled. City Clerk warned that income must be increased or a financial crisis was imminent. No action taken.
8. Clerk said Mrs. Vernon Pendley complained that a city employee had cut some of her flowers while mowing street right of way and she asked \$5.00 for damages. After hearing from Supt. Owens, the council decided Mrs. Pendley wasn't due any compensation.
9. Clerk told council that Mr. R. G. Long was seeking damages for injuries allegedly incurred from being beaten while in jail. Ald. King said he had investigated this case and payment of damages was not justified. Council agreed.
10. Ald. King moved adjournment of this meeting, Ald. David seconded the motion, and it was voted on and passed.
