

DECEMBER 28, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer.

2. Minutes of the December 14 meeting and approved.

3. Ald. David sought and received permission to sign the airport contract with the Federal Aviation Agency.

4. Ald. King made a motion, seconded by Ald. Norton, to borrow \$20,000 from Mr. & Mrs. A. W. Sherman of Adairsville. Interest to be 5%, compounded semi-annually and the money to be used to pay for the airport property. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Council appointed Tom B. David for a five year term on the Recreation Commission to succeed himself and appointed Buford Chitwood to fill the term of Dr. R. D. Walter which ends 12/31/65.

6. Ald. King made a motion to appoint a recorder at a salary of \$100.00 per month. Ald. David seconded and the motion passed.

7. The mayor and aldermen appointed Eugene F. Edge as city recorder effective Jan. 4, 1965.

8. Ald. Woods said Ojay Mills, Inc. had asked for a pumper fire plug to be installed on Oothcaloga St. near their plant and he thought they should have it. Supt. Owens said he would have it installed.

9. Ald. Woods announced that Tesco Chemicals, Inc. of 134 Baker Street, Atlanta was low bidder and had been awarded the '65 contract for chemicals for the water filtration plant.

10. Ald. Norton moved that the Mayor's salary be increased from \$100.00 per month to \$200.00 per month and the Aldermen's salary be \$100.00 per month instead of the present salary of \$50.00 per month effective Jan. 1, 1965. Ald. King seconded the motion and it passed without a dissenting vote.

11. Ald. Norton made a motion to pay the City Board of Education members a salary of \$25.00 per month, subject to legal approval by the city attorney. Ald. David seconded, voted and passed.

12. Supt. Owens told council that Atlantic Engineering had agreed to accept the council's offer of \$8,000.00 for an Elgin Street Sweeper and it had been purchased.

13. Ald. Woods moved to purchase two pick-up trucks from the low bidder, Prater Ford. Ald. David seconded, voted and passed.

14. Supt. Owens advised council that Mr. J. C. Rutledge, an employee of Gordon County, had requested compensation for loading chert on city trucks. Council declined.

15. Ald. David, Gordon Co. CD Director, said he would like to have two or three attend the USCD Region III Training Course in Mobile, Alabama on Feb. 18, 19, 20. There were no objections.

16. Ald. King moved to adjourn, Ald. David seconded and the meeting was declared adjourned by Mayor Dickinson.
