

NOVEMBER 9, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT

1. Rev. Lloyd Napier opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of regular meeting of October 26 read and approved.
3. Mrs. E. F. Walraven, Jr. asked council to pay for approximately five feet of property city used in widening Victory Drive. After discussion, Ald. Norton moved to pay \$150.00 for this damage. Ald. Woods seconded the motion and after Mrs. Walraven assured council this was satisfactory, the motion was passed unanimously.
4. Mr. David Reeves was present seeking information on his claim for damages to his auto. Ald. King recommended that the city attorney be asked to advise council on the legality of the claim. The council agreed and Mr. Reeves was told to see Mr. Maddox.
5. Mr. J. C. Kay, Sr. application for malt beverage license was postponed on recommendation of Ald. King that no action be taken until Mr. Kay's past due taxes were paid. Ald. King made a motion to this effect which was seconded by Ald. David and passed.
6. Ald. David heard in regard to proposed airport. Council gave Mr. David authority to secure option to purchase the land needed from Mr. C. A. Shirley.
7. Ald. David said some of our streets were in bad need of repair. Supt. Owens said many of the streets had been repaired and the others would be as soon as time permitted.
8. Ald. Woods said he didn't see how the city could determine what to do in regard to a large industrial water user until such time as the city was advised definitely as to this potential user's needs. Clerk was instructed to write asking for this information.
9. Ald. Woods reported that Mr. George Hudgens, Jr. had sought his assistance in obtaining water for his new house in Garden Hills Subdivision.
10. Ald. King asked for a progress report on the sewage main to the Hunt Subdivision. Supt. Owens advised that some of the residents there would have sewage by the end of this year.
11. Announced that the 7th District meeting of the Georgia Municipal Association would be held in Rome at the Holiday Inn on Nov 11.
12. County Commissioner-elect Everett Defoor asked council to cooperate with him in providing fire protection for Gordon County.
13. At the request of Mr. J. C. Kay, Sr., council, on motion of Ald. King and second of Ald. Woods, voted to rescind their action of October 26 whereby Mr. Kay's property was annexed to the city.
14. Ald. King moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. David and passed.
