

APRIL 27, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT

1. The Rev. Claude McBride, pastor of the Belmont Baptist Church, delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of regular meeting of April 13 read and approved.
3. Clerk read Mayor Dickinson's veto of the water main extension on S-1800 which was approved by the board of aldermen on April 13.
4. Mr. Vern Kuhlman asked council's cooperation in securing fire protection for Industrial Blvd. and other industrial areas outside the city. Council agreed to send representatives with Mr. Kuhlman on Wednesday, April 29 to meet with the Southeastern Underwriters Assn. in Atlanta to discuss this matter.
5. Mr. Ralph Baker, of a Victory Drive address, requested council to do whatever they could to the street Mr. Jack Hughey had cut to keep his lot from washing down the hill. Council agreed to slope the bank and Mr. Baker said he would sow grass on it.
6. Ald. Woods made a motion to override the Mayor's veto of the S-1800 water main extension, Ald. Norton seconded the motion and Ald. King and David voted with them to install this 6" main two miles west from US 41 north of Oostanaula River bridge on S-1800.
7. Ald. King advised council that a number of the parking meters are worn and need replacing.
8. Ald. King said council should consider levying a sewer service charge.
9. Ald. David moved to give \$250.00 to the Chamber of Commerce to be used to defray expenses in the May 16 Centennial Celebration of the Battle of Resaca. Ald. King seconded this motion which was unanimously passed.
10. Chief Luther Roberts reported to council that the CPA Hatchery on Industrial Blvd. was hauling eggs to the city dump in an open truck and spilling portions of most loads on the streets.
11. Ald. David moved to adjourn, Ald. King seconded the motion which was voted and passed.
