

AUGUST 24, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT EXCEPT ALD. A. J. KING.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of meeting of August 10 read and approved.
3. Ald. Woods heard regarding leaking water meter at H. M. Long house on Elm St.
4. Ald. David expressed concern over status of SR 53 from city limits to US 41. It was agreed that a delegation would visit the State Highway Dept. offices in Atlanta to learn the score.
5. Supt. Owens reported ~~in~~ the GMA power section meeting in Macon Monday, August 31 would be attended by he and the City Clerk.
6. Supt. Owens advised Council that the concrete had been poured at the Negro swimming pool.
7. Frank Walraven and Buddy Davis, representing the Calhoun JC's, asked permission of Council to permit Southern Bell to install a telephone on the sidewalk at corner of Court St. and Park Ave. Mayor Dickinson appointed Ald. Norton and King to handle this.
8. Frank Walraven told Council that the City and the Shopping Center owners had encroached on his property on Victory Drive. Council told Mr. Walraven that Mr. Vern Kuhlman would be written a letter informing him of the complaint and that he, Mr. Walraven, should present the City a bill for the five feet of property allegedly taken by the City.
9. Council appointed Mr. Thurman Roberts, W. R. Norton and Tom B. David as the City Tax Assessors.
10. Ald. Norton made a motion, seconded by Ald. David, to comply with the request of the State Highway Dept. in letter attached and made a part of these proceedings. Motion approved.
11. Chief Luther Roberts said school officials had asked to let students cross Fair St. to concession stands in the Boy Scout Hut during remodeling of the Gym. Council told Chief Roberts to advise that they should use the swimming pool facilities so that they would not have to cross the street and the city would not have to close the street.
12. Ald. David moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. Norton and done.
