


DECEMBER 14, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of the November 23 meeting read and approved.
3. Mr. Bill Greene, of Wiedeman Singleton (the city's consulting engineers), reviewed proposed sewage service charges and estimated cost of sewage treatment plant and trunk and feeder lines. After discussion, Ald. David moved to impose a 50% (of monthly water bill) service charge on all users of the city sewer system, effective with April 5 billing; all money collected to be placed in a sinking fund and to be expended only on the sanitary sewerage system. This motion seconded by Ald. Norton and unanimously passed. (MONTHLY MINIMUM TO BE \$1.00)
4. Ald. King's motion to file application with the Department of Public Health for a grant to assist in the construction of a sewerage treatment plant and system was seconded by Ald. Woods and passed without a dissenting vote.
5. Gordon Co. Commissioner-elect of Roads and Revenues Everette DeFoor advised council that he had called a public meeting in the courthouse on Thursday, Dec. 17 to discuss ways and means of obtaining fire protection for the people of the county and invited all to attend.
6. Ald. King informed council that arrangements had been made for Kenzil B. Smith to pay the city for damages to one of the police cars in an accident in which Mr. Smith admitted he was at fault. Ald. King then moved to accept the bid of Prater Ford (\$2,000.16 with wrecked police car); Ald. Woods seconded the motion which was unanimously passed.
7. Ald. David said he believed the city should buy the tract of land adjacent to the airport property and fronting on U. S. 41, consisting of 22½ Acres at \$350.00 per Acre or about \$7,900.00. Ald. King made the motion to purchase this property, Ald. Norton seconded and the motion was passed.
8. Supt. Owens told council that the proposed site of the new elementary school should, in his opinion, be located between two east-west streets in the Garden Hills subdivision. These streets would form the north and south boundaries with Barrett Road forming the east property line. Mr. Owens said there would be less grading to do at this location. Council agreed and told Mr. Owens to see if the owners would agree to this site.
9. Supt. Owens heard in regard to bids on two pickup trucks, one to be used by the meter readers and the other by the electric department. Ald. Woods suggested that this be delayed until the December 28 meeting and this was done.
10. Supt. Owens brought the street sweeper to the attention of the council again and after discussing the features and prices, Ald. Norton moved to buy the Elgin from Atlantic Engineering provided it could be purchased for \$8,000.00 and the city's old sweeper. Ald. Woods seconded this motion which was voted on and passed.
11. Ald. King moved to adjourn; Ald. Woods seconded and the meeting was adjourned.
