

JAN. 28, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain Jack Lance opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer.
2. Minutes of Jan. 13 meeting read and approved.
3. At the request of council, Mr. R. L. Ferguson, of Dixie Belle Mills, was present to discuss the parking of trailers on W. Line Street. Mr. Ferguson said his company was attempting to solve this problem by purchasing some land near their plant.
4. Mr. Jesse J. Pilcher asked council to pay damages to his car caused by a meter box cover at S. Wall & Hicks Sts. Estimated cost of repair is \$84.00. Ald. David suggested a committee of Ald. Norton and Woods, Supt. Owens and City Attorney Maddox to decide this claim. Mayor Dickinson then appointed this group to act.
5. Ald. Norton inquired if council would grant free parking privileges to case workers from the Dept. of Family and Children's Services (Welfare Dept.), ~~Ald. King said~~ while at the Court House on official business. Ald. King said he could not agree to this and the request was denied.
6. Ald. Woods heard in the matter of extending water main along Fairview-Sugar Valley Road a distance of 1.3 miles. Supt. Owens stated this would require 10 minimums of \$3.50 per month and it was agreed to make this extension when the 10 taps and deposits are made.
7. Ald. Woods said he would like to check Chandler Cemetery with Ald. Norton after a plat of the property is made. Ald. Norton assured Mr. Woods he would be glad to do this.
8. Ald. Woods asked council to pay National Guard unit's gas bill amounting to \$96.39. Ald. David moved this be done, 2nd by Ald. Woods and unanimously passed.
9. Ald. David said he had heard some complaints about the traffic light at N. Wall & N. Court Sts. Mayor referred this to Ald. Norton's committee on streets.
10. Ald. David asked Supt. Owens to proceed with the grading of McConnell Road as soon as weather will permit.
11. Ald. David heard in the matter of the proposed swimming pool to be located near Stephens school. Supt. Owens said he had some plans, but no definite location yet.
12. Ald. David said the local housing authority was anxious for the curb and gutter to be installed. Council authorized Supt. Owens to proceed with this project.
13. Supt. Owens said he had advised Mr. Fred Stephens that he needed an additional water tap at his motel to correct his lack of volume and pressure.
14. Mayor Dickinson appointed Ald. David and Norton as the city's airport committee.
15. Ald. David announced that he would attend the Civil Defense meeting in Rome on Wed., Jan. 29.
16. Petition of Charles R. Carson dba A & W Root Beer, Prater Ford, B. D. Pendley and Mrs. C. R. Pendley to bring their property into the city was granted on motion of Ald. King and second of Ald. David without a dissenting vote.
17. Council instructed clerk to write Garren Construction Co. a letter of thanks for their assistance in clearing the streets of snow and ice during the recent storm.
18. Supt. Owens told council that he felt the stop sign at Line should be removed so that west bound traffic would not be required to stop. No action taken.
19. Council agreed to grant Billy Lewis inside rates for water and lights at his new apartment house on Louise Ave.
20. Bids on garbage truck were opened and Prater Ford's bid was \$10.98 less than Davis Bros. Ald. King moved to buy the Ford, seconded by Ald. Norton and passed.
21. No further business, the meeting was adjourned.
