

March 26, 1956  
Calhoun, Georgia

1. The City Council met in regular session at the City Hall on Monday March 26, 1956 at 7:30 pm with all members present.
2. The minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.
3. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Fox were present and stated that their house was to be finished in about two weeks and they needed water and sewerage to get their G.I. loan. The Council assured Mr. and Mrs. Fox they would get water and sewerage in the neighborhood of two weeks.
4. Mr. David stated to the Council that he planned to go to Atlanta the next day and wanted to know how many radios the City wanted to buy through the Civil Defense. Mr. Dickinson made a motion to purchase two radios seconded by Mr. Edwards voted on and passed. One of the radios was to replace the one due the County.
5. Mr. David reminded the Council that Wednesday was the day for eating the meal at the High School with the Board of Education.
6. Mr. Dickinson brought before the Council the fact that a lot of time and trouble for working the delinquent list of paying customers was being spent by the electrical and office crews. Mr. Dickinson made the motion to charge \$2.50 inside the City and \$3.50 outside for turning the water and power back on after service has been disconnected. This motion seconded by Mr. David. *VOTED ON AND PASSED*
7. Mr. Dickinson reported that Mr. Raymond Bagwell stated he would build a fence within two weeks at the Negro Recreation Center. At this dated no fence has been erected.
8. The City Council instructed Mr. David to purchase 10 helmets for the Vounteer Fire Dept. through the Civil Defense Dept.
9. Mr. Edwards ask the City Engineer about the progress of the new water plant operator. Mr. McDaniel stated that the man was not advanced far enough to be left alone on the job. He also stated that he was going to check Mr. Crump out on the job on Saturday.
10. At this time Mr. Edwards suggest that the City keep the dogs to be killed up for a period of 3 days. It was decided that the City had no place for keeping dogs for this period. No action taken at this time.
11. Charlie Pritchard was present and wanted to know what it would take to get his place of business open again. The Council instructed Charlie to pay his 56' Special Licenses, his light and water bill plus \$10.00 per month until all bills are paid up.
12. Mr. Edwards made a motion to permit any person owning property in the city to put up a guarantee bond for an industrial plant water and light deposit. Others will get someone worth the money to sign their bond. This was seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.
13. M Mayor Lawrence stated that the Textile Manufacturing Association was having trouble building their new building at a certain location in Dalton and that he had written a letter asking them to locate in Calhoun.
14. Mr. Woods made a motion for a resolution to borrow \$2,500.00 from the Calhoun National Bank to purchase the Boy Scout Property.
15. A petition for water on Old Dixie Highway was read at this time.
