City Council Met in regular session at the City Hall At 7:30 PM.  
Mayor Lawrence and Alderman David were absent to fill appointments.


Meeting was opened with prayer by Alderman Frank Dickinson

Mayor Protem Hoyt Edwards presided at the meeting in the absence of Mayor Lawrence.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

1. Mr. Woods brought up vacations for the City Employees . Suggested that Mr. Kendrick work as an extra on the Fire and Police Dept. Also Suggested that Billy Lewis be hired as an extra at the Water Plant to give the operators there their vacation. After discussion it was decided to leave it up to the dept. heads to work out the best possible solution. Mr. Woods made a motion to give a weeks vacation to all City employees who had been with the city for a peroid of six months Vacation to be with pay. Seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed .
2. Mr. Dickinsons stated that the Fire Dept. needed a few small articles and wanted to know what the proper procedure was for buying these small articles. Council stated that any replacements needed by the dept. could be purchased without going through the regular chanel
3. The new house at the Cemetery was discussed. Mr. Woods made a motiøn to put a new roof over the exposed part and let the rest go until a later date seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.
4. A deadline date for the Mason's on the third floor of the Civic Center Building was discussed at this time. After discussion it was decided to table the matter for the time being.
5. Mr. Edwards brought up the matter of extra gasoline money for Mr. Holt at the water plant. The Council decided to wait until the new plant was finished and give Mr. Holt a flat ~~sum~~<sup>sum</sup> for the use of his car in the past months.
6. The City Council instructed the City Engineer to go ahead with the lighting of the softball field. Agreed to light good around the home plate with 40 to 48 lamps.
7. Gossett-Holcomb Ford Agency wanted to rent the last five parking meters on South Wall Street. After discussion it was decided to keep the permits as they are now with only delivery trucks being able to buy one.
8. Council ask City Clerk to contact neighboring cities and see what their distinction was between an auto finance and a small loan business in regard to charges of special licenses.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.
