City Council Met in regular session at the City Hall at 7:30 PM with all members present, ~~*Mayor*~~ except Alderman J. E. Wood, Jr.


Mayor Lawrence opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

It was reported that Alderman Wood was in Atlanta at the Veterans Hospital for an operation. The Council wished for him a speedy recovery.

1. Mr. G. S. Roberts was present and ask the City Council if they would issue him a peddlers license for one half price of \$25.00 since half of the year was gone. He stated that he was looking for a building to sell his produce from but could not locate one at this time. Wanted permission to sell from ~~the street~~ ^{his truck} and stated that he would sell from his truck at one location. Mr. David made a motion to issue the license on a temporary basis, seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.
2. Mr. David stated that the Ground Observer Corp was going on a 24 hour watch in the near future and that they wanted permission from the City to build a watch tower on the lot near the old stand pipe. Also stated that the manager of a Carnival had called and would guarantee \$300.00 to play in Calhoun and it was planned to use this money to build the tower. After discussion it was decided to table this matter for the present.
3. Mr. Dickinson stated that vacations had started and that Mr. Kendrick was not satisfied with the hours he was working ~~in~~ replacement for City employees. After discussion it was decided to hire a new man to work vacation time for the Police and Fire Dept.
4. The Council decided to meet on Monday June 18, 1956 at the City Hall to work on Taxes.
5. Mr. Edwards stated that Mr. J. W. Defoor Would be through at the Civic Center by July 1st.
6. The City Council decided to give Mr. J. W. Holt ten(\$10.00) per month for gasoline instead of letting him get gas from the city pumps. as there was a possibility of people talking if gas was put in private cars.
7. Mayor Lawrence instructed the City Clerk to send a corrected statement to Mr. Bill Moss on the Curb and Gutter.
8. Mr. ~~Cover Shivers~~ ^{Ray Pass} complained to the Mayor that the Ditch on Victory Drive was filled up and water was running over on him. Instructed City Engineer to fix as soon as possible.
9. Mrs Alda Bolding complained that her driveway needed fixing. City Council instructed Mr. McDaniel to fix as soon as possible.
10. Mayor Lawrence instructed the city Engineer to make an estimate on the cost of paving the driveway at the home of Mr. Luke Moore.
11. The road by Dr. Purcell's house was discussed and the city engineer stated that he had planned to pave the road during the summer.
12. At this time a delegation from Oothcalooga Masonic Lodge entered the court room and reported that they had just left a meeting at the Civic Center Building and the Mason's had voted against taking the third floor for their meeting place. In the delegation were Mr. Fred Carter, Dr. Wilbur Hall, Mr. J. A. Kirby, Mr. Thurman Roberts, Mr. Bill Dew, Mr. S. J. Dobson. Mr. Fred Carter expressed regret that they had caused the City so much trouble.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Edwards voted on and passed.
