City Council met in regular session Monday Feb. 23, at 7:30 PM at the City Hall with all members present.


Mayor Lawrence opened the meeting with prayer and the following business was transacted.

1. The minutes of previous meeting read and adopted.
2. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Fox were present in regard to water and sewerage for their new home to be built on Dale Ave. After discussion a motion was made by Mr. David and seconded by Mr. Edwards that the city run sewerage to the Fox property when Mrs. Fox obtained an easement to run the line from Piedmont to the Fox property. Distance of the line to be approximately 400 ft.
3. Mr. David brought up for discussion a hot mix slab for recreation purposes at the high school. The cost would be approximately \$1200.00 No action taken at this time.
4. Mr. Dickinson had Mr. Guy Kendrick present for the purpose of discussing volunteer firemen. Chief Kendrick suggest that the volunteers be paid more money and informs the council that he has 11 volunteers on his list and that he can get in touch with them night of day. He suggests \$5.00 per call. A motion was made by Mr. David to pay all volunteers \$3.00 per call and after training pay \$5.00 per call. Seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed. Radio for the fire truck discussed and Mr. David was to get facts from the Civilian Defense about buying one through their dept.
5. Mr. L.V. Sexton and Mr. M. C. Dobson were present in regard to Mr. Sexton's Beer License. Mr. Sexton stated that he had a man that would build him a new building at a new location on the Rome road if the council would reissue his licenses. The location being the last lot on the Rome road on the left going out of town. After much discussion a motion was made by Mr. Dickinson that the city hold Mr. Sexton's licenses and that they not be reissued at this time. This motion seconded by Mr. David and voted on. Mr. David and Mr. Dickinson voting for the motion, Mr. Edwards voting against the motion, Mr. Woods not voting. Motion did not carry. At this time Mr. Edwards made a motion the licenses be issued to Mr. LyV. Sexton to operate at the above location on the Rome Road. There was no second to his motion. At this time Mr. David made motion to table Mr. Edward's motion, this was seconded by Mr. Dickinson and voted on. Mr. Woods, Mr. David, Mr. Dickinson voting for the motion and Mr. Edwards voting against.
6. Mr. Dickinson brought some prices for the cemetery chimes before the Council for discussion. The Chimes in question would run in the neighborhood of \$200.00. A motion was made by Mr. David to Purchase this equipment seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.
7. The sidewalk in front of Mrs. Pass, Mr. Hall and Mrs Sutherland discussed. Mr. David made motion that city build sidewalk provided these three property owners pay their 2/3 cost. Seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.
8. Mr. Woods brought it to the attention of the city engineer that there were several fire plugs leaking at different location and instructed him to fix them as soon as possible.
9. The open ditch on Oothcalooga and King streets discussed. The cost in front of the Hall property discussed and the council instructed the city engineer to give them approximately the entire cost at the next meeting. The cost being for covering and insalling proper drainage pipe.
10. The City Engineer brought up the pay raise for all hourly employees of the city. After discussion Mr. Edwards made motion to cut the work week from 50 to 44 hours and to raise each employee 20 cents per hour. The effective date to be March 5th. Seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

11. Mr. Billy Hobgood sent word to the council that it was his wishes that his half of the fleet policy with the city be given to someone else as he is now in the life insurance business. A motion was made by Mr. Edwards to ~~his~~ half of the Commission on the fleet policy to Mr. Gus Boaz, Seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

12. The possibility of the city pumping their own gas was discussed at this time. A motion was made by Mr. Dickinson for the city to start pumping their own gas as soon as possible and that each vehicle must obtain their daily supply at the beginning of the days work and at the ending of the days work. Everyone must sign tickets in accordance with the regulations set by the city engineer. This motion seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.
