

November 12, 1956

City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present.

Mayor Lawrence opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. Dick Linning and Mr. Lee Johnson was approved by the City Council for the Police Dept.

Mr. David reported that Mr. John Miller of South Wall Street had approached him about his 1956 city tax. Stated that his house had burned and thought he should have some reduction in his tax. The council agreed to leave Mr. Millers tax as returned.

Mr. Dickinson stated that Clyde Evans still wanted the sidewalk fixed in front of his store. Mr. Edwards made a motion that the city put in a new sidewalk in front of Mr. Evan's Store. This motion seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. Edwards stated that Mrs. Leonard Morris of Hunt's Drive wanted to know if she was in the city the first of the year and if she must pay tax on her house for 1956. Since she had been getting garbage pickup and the inside rate on city water for this period the council agreed that she must pay city tax for 1956.

Mr. Edwards reported that Blanche Gardner had a dead tree in front of her house that she wanted cut. After discussion the council agreed to cut the trees on city property.

Mayor Lawrence stated that he had talked to Mr. Burton J. Bell of the Belmont Farms Inc. about the new water line in that section. Mr. Bell Wanted the City to take up the one inch line on Rips Road and install a four inch line. Mr. David made a motion that Mayor Lawrence draw up an agreement between the City of Calhoun and the Belmont Farms Inc. stating in the agreement the size line recommended by the city engineer and that Belmont Farms Inc., pay for the pipe on purchase of same and the city would repay Belmont Farms Inc. for each tap made on the line at the rate of 100ft. per tap until the line was paid for and that the line would belong to the City. This motion seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed.

Mr. Edwards made the following resolution: That the City Council go on record as expressing their appreciation for the consideration, cooperation and support shown this body by the Calhoun Newspapers Inc., publishers of the Gordon County News and The Calhoun Times, its editors and personnel during this administration, and that this resolution be made a permanent part of this record.

Mr. David made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed
