City council met in regular session at the city hall with all members present.

Mayor Lawrence opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

Mr. David reported to the council that many people had approached him about putting up a red light at the corner of Trammell and North Wall Streets. After discussion no action taken.

~~Mr. Dickinson~~ ^{Mr. Edwards} reported that the people in the vicinity of the Bennett's Cross Road wanted to purchase a fire plug. After discussion it was decided that since the ones wanting the fire plug did not use city water the council decided against giving them a fire plug.

Mayor Lawrence reported that the main floor of the Civic Center needed cleaning and suggested that someone be hired to keep it clean at all times. He stated he would contact Frank McDaniel about the job.

Clyde Evans wanted a cross walk fixed from the corner of ~~Handy~~ ^{Faye} Jewelry across to Thomas Funeral Home. He stated that a lot of people crossed the street here and he thought a walk would help. The city council agreed to fix the cross walk.

Mr. Edwards reported that James Fuller and W. H. Massingill had resigned from the Police Force. The council agreed to wait until Chief Hayes returned from the Peace Officer's Convention to take action.


Mr. Edwards stated to the council that Guy Kendrick wanted to purchase gasoline from the city since he used his truck to fix the parking meters and trips to the barn to give the city vehicles gasoline. After discussion it was decided it would be a bad policy to let Kendrick get gas through the city and the council decided against it.


Mayor Lawrence called a special meeting of the Police Committee and himself for Thursday Oct. 25, 1956 at 10 am.
