

OCTOBER 8, 1962

REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL

WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT

1. Mayor Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of Sept. 24 meeting read by clerk and approved by mayor.
3. Mr. Wm. C. Burdette asked council to close that portion of Second Ave. extending east of King St. and change Harlan St. so it would turn 90 degrees west on north side of Brownlee Warehouse and connect with King St. instead of Second Ave. Mayor Dickinson appointed Ald. King to meet with city attorney and look into the matter.
4. Ald. David reported that Jack Tomlinson had complained of low water pressure. Supt. Owens to check this trouble and correct.
5. Ald. David said V. E. Saunders and others wanted city water at McDaniel Station. Council discussed possibility of extending main south on U. S. 41 and across to Glasrock Products to serve Mr. Saunders, but took no action.
6. Ald. David ~~announced~~ that Roy Hammond, Recreation Director, had resigned effective Nov. 8.
7. Supt. Owens reported on Accelerated Public Works program meeting in Atlanta attended by him and city clerk and stated that he believed city could get 50% matching funds from federal Govt. to lay 16" water main from filter plant to Pine St.
8. Capt. Doyle Phillips, company commander of local National Guard unit, explained to council that the state didn't allow him enough money to pay utility bills. Council assured Mr. Phillips that the city would furnish water and electricity to the Guard free of charge, except for the maintenance shop which bill is to be paid by the state.
9. Ald. Lewis expressed desire to have more parking meters installed to facilitate parking in business district and especially recommended meters be placed on west side of Park Ave. from Court St. south to railroad. Supt. Owens said this would be done as soon as he could schedule it.

10. Ald. Lewis instructed Chief of Police Roberts to stop automobile parking on sidewalks and to have offenders' autos towed in if necessary.
11. City Clerk announced that the new charter was ready for publication pending receipt of description of city limits by Municipal Code Corp. of Tallahassee, Fla. Supt. Owens preparing description.
12. Mayor Dickinson expressed concern about older children's Halloween conduct. Council instructed Chief Roberts to prevent children above fifth grade from tricking or treating and agreed to publish in local paper a resolution to that effect.
13. Bids on plumbing truck opened and read; Roy Davis Chevrolet-Oldsmobile, Inc. bid \$2028,50 and Owens-Prater Ford, Inc. bid \$1925.00. Truck was purchased from Owens-Prater (low bidder) on motion of Ald. King and second of Ald. Lewis without a dissenting vote.
14. Supt. Owens asked council to raise salary of Estes Pass to \$325.00 monthly which is same as Hugh Perry drew as second shift water plant operator. Request granted by council.
15. Ald. Lewis attended meeting at NW Ga. Experiment Station and reported on scheduled projects on US R 65 and SR 53, descriptions of the three projects are attached hereto.
16. No further business, meeting adjourned.

1. Project F 065-1 (5) beginning at Oothkalooga Creek bridge on State Route 53 and extending north 1.070 miles to State Route 3, U. S. 41 in Calhoun, will include grading, drainage, widening, Rural and Urban Hightype paving and resurfacing.
2. Project F 065-1 (6) beginning approximately 1.4 miles south of Northwest Georgia Experiment Station and extending east on new location to junction with State Route 3 (U. S. 41) and State Route 53 southeast of Calhoun. This project will include grading, drainage, one bridge, and paving.
3. Project F 065-2 (4) beginning at the junction of State Route 53 and U. S. 41 and extending southeast 0.980 miles to the Interchange with Interstate Route 75. This improvement will include grading, drainage and paving.
