

July 23, 1962

City Council met in regular session at the city hall with the following members present: Mayor, Frank M. Dickinson, Alderman Tom B. David, Alderman Jerry King. Alderman John A. Lewis, Jr. and Alderman John T. Woods, Jr. were absent and away at National Guard Camp.

Mayor Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the Council.

Mr. Harbin King was present at the meeting in the interest of the Calhoun Lion's Club. Mr. King requested the council to waive the license on a circus in the city and stated the Lion's Club was interested in sponsoring the show to raise money for the obligations of the Lion's Club. The license being \$100.00 per day for the circus and under the contract the sponsor must pay all license fees. After discussion the council felt it would be opening the gate for future trouble with other clubs and felt they should stay with the original ordinance.

Mr. Gene Pass was present and presented a petition with 201 names requesting the city to install parking meters around the new courthouse. Alderman King made a motion that the area in front of the courthouse on U.S.#41 be yellow curbed and allow no parking at anytime. This motion received a second from Alderman David was voted on and passed. Mayor Dickinson voting to make the quorum. The Council decided to take the matter around the rest of the courthouse up with the County Commissioner and see what his reaction would be. Mr. King reported he would contact the Commissioner within the next week. *PETITION RE: DAVID 7/15/62 AT REQUEST OF GENE PASS.*

Alderman King reported that he and Alderman Lewis had met on King Street between Court and Oothcalooga and had decided on the following regarding parking in the East side of the Street. Decided to restrict parking from 11am to 2pm and from 4pm to 7pm on the East Side of King between Court Street and Oothcalooga St. The Council was in agreement and decided to amend the traffic ordinance to include this change.

Mayor Dickinson appointed Mr. H.T. Jones to the Calhoun Housing Authority for a period of five years. This being from July 16, 1962 until July 16, 1967. The council was in agreement with this appointment.

Supt. James S. Owens reported he had made a study of the water pressure on the water line out the Hall Memorial Road and found that to extend the line for another mile would lower the pressure to an extent that would be unsatisfactory to the new customers. The council decided against extending the line to any new customers.

Council agreed to meet on August 6th to further study the budget for the coming fiscal year.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
