

SEPT. 10, 1962

Regular Meeting of City Council

All Members Present

1. Mayor Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer
2. Dr. Ed Brooks requested council to lower his tax assessment to \$1,000.00 on his office equipment which is same as other dentists. This request complied with.
3. Mr. Roy Davis paid \$630.00 for surfacing of Sequoyah Terrace, which amount had been collected from various parties interested. Council Accepted money and instructed Mr. Owens to proceed with widening and paving of this street.
4. Ald. Lewis mentioned the blocking of street crossings by the L&N Railroad and instructed Mr. Owens to write L & N superintendent to prevent further occurrences of this nature.
5. Ald. Lewis heard in regard to sewer construction in the Hunt sub-division. After discussion, council asked Supt. Owens to contact Bill Green, engineer with Weideman-Singleton, and have him survey and plan sewagesystem for entire city.
6. Mr. Wallace Burton asked council what course of action he should pursue to have Pisgah Way curbed and guttered from intersection of Chandler St. north. Usual procedure to be followed.
7. Following tax adjustments made: John Bruce, 341 S. Wall house assessed at \$1200.00; Miss Tilla Rooker's residence at \$5,000.00; Mrs. Ollie Serritt's house on College St. at \$1800.00
8. Mr. Sim Sutherland, holder of beer license for N. Wall location, was called before council concerning an incident which resulted in one man being hospitalized for treatment of knife wounds. Mr. Sutherland stated that the violence occurred outside his place of business after he had closed, but was warned that council held him responsible and would condone no further acts of violence.
9. Mrs. Max Tolbert's request for relief from storm sewer damage brought to attention of council by Ald. King. Supt. Owens to inspect and advise.

10. Ald. Woods asked council to purchase used air conditioner for firemen's quarters. Council agreed to pay \$50.00 for 3/4 ton unit.

11. Application of Mr. George R. Baker for Beer License rejected because Mr. Baker did not meet residency requirement of ordinance.

12. Supt. Owens instructed to get bids on plumbing truck.

13. Mr. James Boyd, executive secretary of Calhoun Housing Authority, asked city to appropriate \$200.00 for preliminary work in conjunction with authority's request for more housing units. Tabled until
