Calhoun, Georgia

City Council met in regular session at the city hall with all members present.

Dr. T. J. Lance opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and approved by the council.

Gordon County Commissioner John Slagle was present at the meeting and requested that the city sell the electric power to the county at a reduced rate since the new courthouse building was requiring a large amount of power. After discussion Alderman David made a motion that the City of Calhoun furnish power to any and all county buildings at one cent per kilowatt. This motion received a second from Alderman Lewis was voted on and passed.

Alderman King expressed appreciation to Mr. Slagle for the help he had given in securing street aid inside the city limits of the City of Calhoun.

Mr. Harry Lawrence was present at the meeting and requested the City to run water to the Glassrock Products Co. on the McDaniel Road. Mr. Lawrence stated the industry was planning an expansion program and would need additional water. The Council ask Mr. Lawrence to get additional information about the usage of the plant and instructed City Supt. James Owens and Alderman John Lewis to get with Mr. Lawrence and see what could be worked out.

Mr. Lawrence also stated the owners of the new proposed shopping center in the southern part of the city was interested in bringing all the property into the city limits. Mr. Lawrence requested the city to furnish outside flood lights for the parking area and sweep the parking lot each day. He requested this be drawn up in a contract that would be binding on the city. After discussion the council agreed to light and sweep the area in the same manner as the downtown area.

Mr. Lawrence stated that three new homes had been built in the Woodland Hills Subdivision and the owners needed the city to run a sanitary sewer line to the area. The Owners had agreed to pay for the materials for a pumping station and the lines and the city agreed to install with city labor. The council instructed the City Supt. to check the matter out and report by the next meeting.

Alderman King made a motion that Mr. Mack Graham be permitted to purchase the interest of Joe Talley in Fred and Joe's Cab Co. This motion received a second from Alderman Lewis and was voted on and passed.

The Council agreed to limit the speed by the Stephens School on McConnel Road to 15 miles per hour. Agreed to ammend the traffic ordinance to this effect.

The Council discussed the possibility of a red light at the intersection of Fain and North Wall Streets. After discussion it was decided that a 1500 foot view was not possible at this location.

The Council agreed to give permission to CorMac Mills to install an alarm system in the Fire Department. The Company agreed to pay \$50.00 per call to the owners.

The Council agreed to refund \$6500.00 to Mr. A. R. McDaniel Jr. for the Dave Nelson property on West Line Street and give him a 30 day option to purchase when the title was cleared to the property. J. C. Maddox, City Attorney, was instructed to start work toward clearing the title to the property.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
