

APRIL 24, 1972-REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT  
INCLUDING RANDY REESE, YOUTH DAY MAYOR.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the regular meeting of April 10 and the called meeting of April 18 read and approved.
3. Council discussed selling water to Gordon County.
4. Ald. Padgett said he felt the city should pay the difference in the cost between the 8 inch sewer line required to serve the property of Dean Hayes and Milton Stewart and the 12 inch main the city wishes to install and estimated the cost at \$2,000. It was agreed that there will be no rebates after five years. At the suggestion of Electric Supt. Jack Bell, the developers agreed to use city power in the proposed subdivision.
5. Application for malt beverage license of Charley Butler on Alexander St. read and referred to Ald. Cox.
6. Ald. Cox said the police needed an old pickup for the dogpound.
7. Ald. Cox said Comm. DeFoor advises that \$1,000.00 is all he will pay for the old fire truck.
8. Ald. Padgett said the residents near the intersection of Buena Vista and Meadow Lane wanted the stop sign placed on Buena Vista Drive. Chief Hayes to recommend.
9. Ald. Padgett said several members of the First Baptist Church had requested that Trammell St. be designated one way east. Chief Hayes to make his recommendation at the May 8 meeting.
10. Supt. Owens advised that the water dept. needs another plumbing truck.
11. Mrs. Frank Stephens petition for annexation of 12 lots in Devonwood S/D accepted following motion of Ald. David and Padgett with the understanding that a pumping station will be required for sanitary sewer service and with the further understanding that the city will not bear the cost of said pumping station.
12. Clerk advised that A. H. Scoggins had asked permission to cover five parking meters at his store. Mr. Scoggins agreed to pay the full fee.
13. Ald. Padgett heard in regard to the embankment at the shopping center. Supt. Owens said the owners had started moving dirt this week.
14. Council approved 10 water taps recommended by the committee on motion of Ald. Padgett and David.
15. Chief Hayes expressed his concern as to city limits on the south side of town. He said it is difficult to determine what property is inside the city.
16. Clerk instructed to prepare a petition for the control and legalization of alcoholic beverages.
17. Ald. Padgett moved that the city pay Billy Lackey's regular salary until he is able to return to work. Ald. Cox 2nd and the motion was voted on and passed.
18. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
