

AUG. 14, 1972-REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Dr. T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the July 24 meeting read and approved.
3. Mrs. Tom (Kay) Pope asked permission to use the two newest buildings at College St. Elementary for a day nursery sponsored by the federal government. Mrs. Pope said this nursery will absorb the Roland Hayes Day Nursery and the buildings will be renovated at no cost to the city. Council agreed to permit this for two years following motion of Ald. Padgett and David.
4. Ald. Cox moved the adoption of an ordinance prohibiting the consumption of beer at any public place except where it is purchased. Ald. Padgett seconded and the motion was adopted. Mrs. Edna Langford, Chairman of the Calhoun Recreation Commission, asked Council to erect a sign, warning that alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the recreation area, at the entrance to the park. This was agreed to by the Council.
5. Ald. David moved that the city approve construction of 4 tennis courts at a cost of some \$25,000.00. The federal government to reimburse 1/2 this cost and the county 1/4. Ald. Collins 2nd and the motion was unanimously adopted.
6. A delegation from Idle Acres S/D asked to have this property annexed to the city. Council advised that the area is not now contiguous to property in the city but Supt. Owens will determine best method to accomplish annexation and advise.
7. Ald. Padgett moved to permit the temporary use of a mobile home for offices for Shamrock Carpet Mills on S. River St. (This trailer must be removed no later than April 1, 1973.) 2nd by Ald. Cox and passed.
8. Ald. Collins offered a motion to approve the rent supplement application request of Charles Williams Real Estate Investment Corp. for a proposed apartment house on Red Bud Rd. Mayor Dickinson declared a "no motion" after calling three times for a second.
9. Ald. Padgett moved to authorize Supt. Owens as voting delegate to the GMA Power Section with Elec. Supt. Bell as alternate. Ald. Cox seconded and the motion was approved.
10. Ald. David said he had been asked to get some kudzu vines cut on the portion of Oothcaloga St. under construction. No action was taken since this is private property.
11. Ald. David reported that F. J. Richardson would like to open a new subdivision SE of the city if water is available. It was agreed that we cannot supply sufficient water for present needs to this area.
12. Ald. David heard in regard to delinquent accounts. Clerk stated that the city attorney might be reluctant to force payment of these accounts and Council authorized the clerk to acquire the services of another attorney, if necessary, to collect same.
13. Ald. Cox read two special license applications to vote on at the Aug. 28 meeting: Donald Jacks, coin operated pool tables adjacent to his barber shop on Oothcaloga St. and Billy Talley, cab stand with 3 cars at Oothcaloga and King Sts.


- 14. Ald. Cox moved that a committee be appointed to recommend awards to be given employees with 25 or more consecutive years of service to the city; 2nd by Ald. David and approved.
- 15. Ald. Cox moved to adopt and accept the revised Zoning Map as the official zoning map of the City of Calhoun. Ald. David 2nd the motion and it was approved.
- 16. Supt. Owens said that the shopping center owners have reached the "fill in" stage in their construction to prevent Victory Drive from eroding further.
- 17. Clerk read letter from National Center for Voluntary Action acknowledging receipt of the city's nomination of the Calhoun-Gordon County Volunteer Water Safety Program for an award.
- 18. Clerk said that R. F. Chance had asked the city to quit-claim a 10 x 55 foot lot in Chandler Cemetery. No action.
- 19. Council decided to study the request of the City Board of Education for \$375,000 as the city's part of the 1972-73 school budget.
- 20. Water Supt. Bowman recommended 10 water taps and they were OK'd on motion of Ald. Padgett and David.
- 21. Joe Talley complained that surface water from a large drainage ditch is undermining his house. Supt. Owens to investigate.
- 22. J. C. Boyd, Executive Director of the Calhoun Housing Authority, asked when he could expect the city to construct a manhole to prevent sewage from backing into the project apartments. Council instructed Mr. Bowman to do this as soon as he can.
- 23. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Cox and done.
