

SEPT. 25, 1972 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Sept. 11 meeting read and approved.
3. The mayor welcomed Mrs. Kyle Smith and several members of her class.
4. John Shivers requested Council to approve a lease agreement for pole mounted waste receptacles. Council agreed to give Mr. Shivers an answer at the Oct. 9 meeting.
5. Lex Jolley presented an ordinance calling for the issuance of an additional one million dollars in water and sewer bonds. Ald. David moved the adoption of the ordinance, 2nd by Ald. Padgett, voted on and passed.
6. Frank Hicks and Beth Bennett, representing the Voluntary Action Center, asked the Council for a donation of \$5,000 for 1973 operations. City Attorney Shanahan will first be asked to rule on the legality of the request.
7. Ald. Cox heard in regard to the dumping of trash at Barrett and Red Bud Roads. Supt. Owens to contact the owner of the property.
8. Ald. Cox, after Neal Sutherland had presented a petition against the issuance of a package malt beverage license and Clint Taylor offered one in favor of granting the license, moved that Mr. Taylor's application be approved at 1227 N. Wall St.; 2nd by Ald. Padgett with Ald. Cox, Padgett and Collins voting aye and Ald. David abstaining.
9. Ald. Collins heard in the matter of the sidewalk on the south side of Court St. Council agreed to repair same.
10. Ald. David heard again with reference to the trees to be cut at Tom B. David Airport.
11. Ald. David moved to install a 3/4" water tap and 1 light at the new recreation pavilion; 2nd by Ald. Cox and passed.
12. Supt. Owens said some individuals in the business of pumping out septic tanks had asked to dump at the new sewerage treatment facility. Council set fee at \$10 per truck load.
13. Supt. Owens asked and received permission to accept bids on a new street sweeper and two pickup trucks.
14. Supt. Owens said he had discussed with V. D. Parrott, Dalton's superintendent of utilities, the joint building of a raw water pumping station on the Coosawattee River.
15. Supt. Owens advised that he has prepared a request for a grant on water and sewer system expansion from HUD.
16. Supt. Owens announced his resignation but agreed to remain until a successor is appointed.
17. Ald. David moved to pay \$750 additional Chamber of Commerce dues provided the county will match it; 2nd by Ald. Collins and passed.
18. Georgia Textile Corp. was granted a variance from the zoning ordinance to permit them to build 7 ft. closer to River St. than the ordinance permits. This done following motion of Ald. Cox and Ald. Collins.
19. Ald. Cox said he wished to increase the amount for awards for employees with 25 years service to enable the city to purchase and present rings to these employees. Approved on motion of Ald. Cox and Ald. Padgett.


20. Clerk advised that an Atlanta management and research firm is to have a representative here on Oct. 23.
21. Council approved 6 water taps on motion of Ald. Padgett and David.
22. Water Supt. Bowman estimated that the city lost some two million gallons of water over the week-end due to broken mains.
23. Elec. Supt. Bell said some Christmas decorations have been purchased and that Mrs. Pearl King has asked the city to assist in decorating the shopping center.
24. Supt. Bell received permission to send M. J. West to an Allis-Chalmers regulator school in Gadsden, Alabama.
25. Chief Hayes suggested the speed limit on S. River St. should be 45 mph. Council agreed.
26. Bldg. Insp. Davis has condemned as unfit for human habitation 4 dilapidated, but unoccupied houses.
27. Housing Authority Director J. C. Boyd asked for speed limit signs for the project. Mayor Dickinson instructed Supt. Owens to explore the possibility of using speed breakers.
28. Clerk instructed to advertise the upcoming city general election.
29. Chief Hayes asked for a traffic light at US 41 and SR 53. Highway Department to be contacted.
30. An Ordinance amending Section 3-24 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Calhoun was adopted on a motion by Ald. Cox and 2nd by Ald. David.
31. An Ordinance amending Section 3-22 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Calhoun was adopted on a motion by Ald. Collins and 2nd by Ald. Padgett.
32. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
