

JULY 24, 1972 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation,
2. Minutes of the July 10 regular meeting and the July 14 called meeting read and approved.
3. Council discussed extension of sanitary sewer service to the Milton Stewart S/D adjacent to Spring Valley S/D. Mr. Stewart agreed that the city will furnish electricity to the site and Ald. Padgett moved to proceed with the installation of the sewer line and negotiate the bid. Ald. Cox seconded the motion and it was approved.
4. David Bowers of the Coosa Valley APDC and Major Snow of Bill Sanders & Associates reported that the prospects for an Urban Renewal Program are excellent. Ald. Padgett moved that they pursue the matter and determine the cost to the city and advise. Ald. David 2nd and the motion was approved.
5. Ald. Padgett heard in regard to 4-laning the Red Bud Rd. from I-75 to 41. Asst. Supt. Fox and City Attorney Shanahan said this is a state aid project and is in progress.
6. A representative of the Charles Williams Real Estate Investment Corp. was advised by motion of Ald. David and Cox that he may have a decision next meeting night on the proposed apartment complex on the Red Bud Rd.
7. Dwight Walraven and Jack Stepp requested water service to a new subdivision, Crestmont, north of E. Line St. and west of Barrett Rd. After discussion, Mayor Dickinson instructed Ald. Padgett, Supt. Fox and Water Supt. Bowman to report on this at the Aug. 14 meeting.
8. Former alderman, Dr. R. D. Walter, asked Council to approve painting the center line on Pine St. at the curvenorth of Alabama-Georgia freight office.
9. Ald. David moved to grant the Calhoun-Gordon County Library an additional \$300.00 annually; 2nd by Ald. Padgett and OK'd.
10. Ald. David moved to charge truck leasing companies \$75.00 per annum for a business license; 2nd by Ald. Cox and passed.
11. Ald. David obtained Council's approval to repair the roof of the chapel at Chandler Cemetery.
12. Ald. Cox heard in reference to delinquent taxes.
13. Ald. Collins asked about the business license schedule and Mayor Dickinson appointed Ald. Collins and Padgett and the clerk to revise this ordinance and present to the Council for approval.
14. Asst. Supt. Fox advised that four proposed tennis courts on a 200 x 300 foot slab would cost approximately \$25,000.00.
15. Clerk read petition for annexation of the property of M/M Alton McDaniel on the west side of US 41 N near King Ford Tractor Co. It was accepted following motion of Ald. Padgett and Cox.
16. Clerk referred to letters from the Public Service Comm. concerning public hearings on rate increase requests (retail) by Atlanta Gas Light Co. and Georgia Power Co.

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17. Resolution authorizing continued membership in the Power Section of the Georgia Municipal Association and payment of annual dues in the amount of \$1,284.60 adopted on motion of Ald. David and Cox.
18. Asst. Supt. Fox reported that certain land developers offered to deposit \$12,000.00 to have a subdivision between Amakanata and Lovers' Lane Road served with water. No action taken.
19. Mayor Dickinson opened bids on a pickup truck for meter reading, but no action taken due to confusion in the quoted prices.
20. Water Supt. Bowman said the pump on the Plainville main had burned out and the pump on the high pressure line is overloaded.
21. Council discussed the old fire truck and the clerk advised that the county was repairing the engine.
22. Ald. Cox heard with reference to selling old trucks and police car.
23. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
