

NOV. 27, 1972 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON, ALDERMEN DAVID, COX AND COLLINS PRESENT, ALD. PADGETT ABSENT.

1. Rev. J. W. Burchett delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Nov. 13 meeting read and approved.
3. Mrs. Bobbie Mathews asked Council to appropriate \$500.00 for repairing the annex to the College St. School for the Day Care Center. This expenditure was approved following motion of Ald. David and Ald. Cox.
4. Billy Parker of 111 Roberts St. was granted a variance from the Zoning Ordinance to permit him to complete the addition to his residence after it was established that the addition would not obstruct the view of motorists at this intersection and the house will be 16 ft. from the right of way of Hunt Drive. Ald. David moved and Ald. Cox 2nd to cite Parker for violating the zoning ordinance; voted on and passed.
5. Wayne Hall asked for water service to a house in Hall Estates S/D and agreed to remove a trailer from the s/d to compensate. This was approved on motion of Ald. David and Collins.
6. Mr. Hall requested water off the Sugar Valley Road and, after Water Supt. Bowman advised the water supply is adequate in this area, Ald. David moved to make this extension, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
7. John W. Reese, dba Calhoun Electrical & Mechanical Systems, Inc., questioned the section of the gas code relating to the use of galvanized and/or black pipe and added that he would like to have a copy of all codes relative to his business. After discussion, Ald. David moved to permit Mr. Reese to make the installation at the Colorset plant according to his interpretation of the code.
8. Ald. David moved to adopt the 1971 edition of the Gas Code of the Southern Standard Building Code and accepted Ald. Cox's amendment to require galvanized pipe under houses or require black pipe to be painted and pipe in commercial and industrial buildings be painted yellow. Ald. Cox 2nd and the motion was approved.
9. Ald. David moved to employ a surveyor to plat both old and new sections of Chandler Cemetery, 2nd by Ald. Cox and passed.
10. Ald. Cox stated that the city's Christmas decorations look better than ever.
11. Ald. Collins reported that the Voluntary Action Center has been advised by City Attorney Shanahan that a commission will have to be appointed by the city and/or county to superintend the operation of the center before the city can legally make donations.
12. Ald. Cox heard in regard to the bank at the shopping center; clerk to write owners to complete repairs.
13. Mayor Dickinson said the Seventh Day Adventist Church had asked to park a trailer downtown on January 16, 1973 to distribute free literature, medical and dental.
14. Supt. Owens heard in reference to extension of Red Bud Rd. and advised that Mt. Vernon Mills was concerned that their building would be within 15 ft. of the r/w of the new road. Ald. David moved to grant Mt. Vernon a variance, 2nd by Ald. Collins and passed.

15. Supt. Owens advised that the city needs to purchase approximately 32 acres of land from the Slagle Moss Estate at \$1,000.00 per A. Ald. Cox moved to make this purchase, 2nd by Ald. David and approved. (This land needed for sludge basins at the water filtration plant.)
16. Clerk read applications for liquor licenses of Don O. Lewis at 344 S. Wall St., Tom and Alice Crosson at 204 Park Avenue and Champion H. Kelly and J. Frank Stephens on the Red Bud Rd.
17. Several water taps approved on motion of Ald. David and Ald. Cox.
18. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Cox and done.
