



JAN. 10, 1972 = REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON,  
ALDERMEN DAVID, COX, PADGETT AND COLLINS PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Dec. 27 meeting read and adopted.
3. Mayor Pro Tem Tom David administered the oath of office to Mayor Dickinson, re-elected for the fifth time.
4. Mayor Dickinson then swore in re-elected Ald. George Cox and, serving his first term, Ald. Edward W. "Ted" Collins.
5. All department heads were re-appointed on motion of Ald. Cox and 2nd of Ald. Padgett.
6. Ald. David was re-elected Mayor Pro Tem following motion of Ald. Padgett and Cox.
7. Ald. David and Cox moved that Tom Shanahan be retained as city attorney; motion carried.
8. Chaplain T. J. Lance was re-appointed on motion of Ald. Cox and 2nd of Ald. Padgett.
9. Ald. Padgett moved, Ald. David seconded, to name Lex Jolley as the city's fiscal agent.
10. Ald. Padgett moved that the Calhoun First National Bank be declared the official depository of the city; Ald. Cox seconded and the motion was passed.
11. The city's auditor, R. M. Dobbs, CPA, was re-appointed on motion of Ald. Padgett and Cox.
12. Ald. David moved to accept the bond ordinance, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved. (Copy on opposite page.)
13. Ald. Cox moved to sell the \$1,100,000 water and sewer revenue bonds to Lex Jolley & Co., 2nd by Ald. Padgett, voted on and passed.
14. Mrs. Trammell S. Worley complained that her son was arrested for loitering on Dec. 25 and she stated that he was not guilty as he was with her. Mayor Dickinson said he would give Phil the benefit of any doubt and dismissed the charges.
15. James C. Boyd, Executive Director of the Housing Authority, asked Council to approve the expenditure of approximately \$250.00 for a land use map. This was done on motion of Ald. Cox and David.
16. Ald. David moved to increase the allotment to the recreation commission to \$25,000.00 per annum provided they pay their utility bills from this amount; 2nd by Ald. Cox and passed.
17. Ald. Padgett commended the Fire & Police departments and the department heads for their good work in 1971.
18. Ald. Cox said he seconded Ald. Padgett's remarks and added that he would like to see all houses in the city re-numbered.
19. Supt. Owens reported that Arlen's had announced they will build a shopping center on SR 53 between I-75 and Us 41.
20. The emblem of the Calhoun Police Dept. is protected by adoption of ordinance on motion of Ald. David, 2nd of Ald. Cox.
21. Property of Mrs. F. D. Hunt, Arden J. King and Gene Van Buskirk annexed on motion of Ald. David and Ald. Padgett.
22. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
