

DEC. 25, 1972 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON,
ALDERMEN DAVID, COX, PADGETT AND COLLINS PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson called the meeting to order.
2. Minutes of the regular meeting of Dec. 11 and the called meeting of Dec. 14 read and approved.
3. Ald. Cox moved to grant Charles F. Giddens a liquor license at 1305 US 41 South, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and unanimously approved.
4. Clerk read applications for liquor licenses of Ben D. Morrow, Jr. on SR 53 and John L. Ray, Jr. at 358 S. Piedmont St.
5. Supt. Owens announced that Arnall and Nannie Holcomb will accept \$8,500.00 and six months free house rent for their house on Red Bud Road. Ald. Cox moved to accept this offer, 2nd by Ald. Collins and approved.
6. Ald. David reported that some of the residents in the area of Fain and College Sts. had asked that the traffic light be replaced.
7. Ald. David heard in regard to the Chandler Cemetery plat.
8. Ald. David delivered a brief farewell address at the close of nearly one-quarter of a century of service as a city alderman. Mr. David agreed to continue to serve as Civil Defense Director.
9. Ald. Collins advised anyone interested to purchase cemetery lots now as he will recommend an increase in the price of same after Jan. 1, 1973.
10. Police Chief Hayes read an ordinance from Rome and recommended passage of same. Ald. Cox and Padgett moved to aske Rep. Shanahan and Senator Langford to introduce legislation to amend the city charter at the '73 session of the General Assembly adopting such an ordinance which will permit city police to follow-up on burglaries and other crimes perpretrated in the city when the suspect lives outside the city limits. Council approved the motion.
11. Council commended retiring alderman Tom B. David for his 22 plus consecutive years of service to the city.
12. Ald. Collins moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Cox and done.
