

OCT. 23, 1972 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Oct. 9 meeting read and approved.
3. Hoyt Gladney inquired as to progress on the wall at the Gordon Hills Shopping Center and stated that it seemed to him that no real progress has been made. After discussion, the Council instructed the city attorney and the clerk to send letters to the owners requesting an early completion of the wall.
4. Ald. David moved to permit John Allen King, Jr., dba Meadowbrook Dairy, to re-construct his building on the original location. Ald. Padgett 2nd and the motion was approved.
5. Ald. Cox moved to allow all beer wholesalers to replace all stock damaged by fire at Smitty's Beverage Store without again paying city taxes on such stock provided it is destroyed; 2nd by Ald. Padgett and passed.
6. Ald. Collins moved to dispense with the first reading of the proposed liquor and wine ordinances. Ald. Cox 2nd and the motion was unanimously approved.
7. The clerk read the liquor ordinance as drawn by City Attorney Tom Shanahan and Ald. Cox moved its adoption. Ald. Collins seconded and the motion was approved and the ordinance adopted without a dissenting vote.
8. The clerk read the wine ordinance as drawn by the city attorney and Ald. Cox moved its adoption. Ald. Collins seconded and the ordinance was approved unanimously.
9. Ald. Padgett said the center line on Cherry Hill Drive should be painted.
10. Ald. David asked for two street lights at the recreation pavilion and, after Elec. Supt. Bell estimated the cost at \$300, moved that they be installed. Ald. Cox 2nd and the motion was approved.
11. Council agreed to again enforce the Halloween ordinance which restricts "trick or treating" to children in the first five grades of school and under or pre-school kids.
12. Bids opened on a street sweeper with Brackett Equipment Co. offering an Elgin for \$11,200.00 and Williams Truck & Equipment Co. asking \$13,450.00 for a Wayne. Council was advised by Supt. Owens that the old sweeper could be kept for parts for \$1.00. Ald. Collins moved to accept the low bid; 2d by Ald. Cox and passed.
13. Asst. Supt. Fox reported that a land use study will cost approximately \$3,000.00, but the local share is only \$187.50. Ald. Padgett and David moved to proceed with the study and Ald. Collins and Cox agreed.
14. Asst. Supt. Fox advised that Recreation Commission Chairwoman Edna Langford has asked for the lighting of the new tennis courts. Elec. Supt. Bell said this will have to be contracted.
15. Mr. Bell and the clerk reported on the recent meeting of the GMA Power Section in Atlanta and the Oct. 21 meeting with representatives of City of Dalton, City of LaFayette and NGEMC in Dalton.
16. Water Supt. Bowman stated that we still have "muddy" water reports, but no definite pattern can be determined.
17. A water tap was approved for Tolbert DeFoor following motion of


18. Ald. Padgett moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Collins and done.
