

MAY 8, 1972 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON, ALDERMEN COX, DAVID AND PADGETT PRESENT, ALD. COLLINS ABSENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the April 24 meeting read and approved.
3. Council discussed making Trammell St. one way east between Park and N. Wall. Mayor Dickinson advised that Dr. G. C. Kirkley, Jr. objected to this and no action was taken.
4. Mrs. Edna Langford, Chairman of the Calhoun Recreation Commission, reported on the commission's needs with emphasis on the pavilion.
5. Tom Pope, member of the Gordon Hospital Authority, requested the Council to participate in the uniform hospital sign program and advised that each sign costs \$3.95. Council instructed Supt. Owens to determine the number of signs required inside the city.
6. John W. Reese, owner of Calhoun Electrical Mechanical Systems, said many contractors are not paying for licenses and permits and suggested the Council pass an ordinance requiring all vehicles used in construction and repair work be marked so as to properly identify the contractor.
7. Rain Taylor of Tri-State Mobile Homes told Council that the proposed mobile home park on Peters St. has been re-designed and asked for approval to construct a park there.
8. Ald. Cox stated that he was happy to have Gus Boaz with the city and reported that Mr. Boaz is doing an excellent job collecting delinquent licenses.
9. Ald. Cox moved to grant Charley Butler a malt beverage retail license for an Alexander St. address to be known as "Eureka Inn". Ald. Padgett seconded the motion and it was approved.
10. Ald. Cox heard in regard to requesting the State Highway Dept. to annex the portion of state routes to be patrolled by the police department.
11. Ald. Cox heard with reference to Max Payne's application for a retail package malt beverage license. Mayor Dickinson asked for a motion, but none was offered.
12. Ald. Padgett heard in regard to curbing and guttering Pisgah Way and Buena Vista Rd. and re-surfacing both streets.
13. Ald. Cox moved to permit Scoggins-McBrayer Furniture to cover the five parking meters at Park and Harlan from Thanksgiving to Christmas provided the regular parking fees are paid. Ald. David 2nd and the motion was voted on and passed.
14. Mayor Dickinson opened bids on a cab and chassis for a plumbing truck for the water department with Prater Ford bidding \$2779.00 and Roy Davis-\$2791.87 and on a police cruiser with Prater at \$3694.00 and Roy Davis quoting \$3854.37. Ald. Padgett moved to accept the low bids, 2nd by Ald. Cox and passed.
15. Supt. Owens advised that the Gordon Hills Shopping Center owners have started construction to eliminate the hazard at Victory Dr. and the shopping center.
16. Council ordered the '41 fire truck sold to the highest bidder.
17. Ald. Padgett moved to approve all water taps recommended by the committee. Ald. Cox 2nd and the motion was voted on and passed.
18. Chief Hayes reported that Charles Carson had asked for the "No

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Parking" sign in front of his house to be raised so as not to obstruct the view of oncoming traffic when entering N. Wall St.

19. Ald. Padgett asked for a stop sign to be installed at Buena Vista Rd. and Meadow Lane to permit traffic on Meadow Lane to proceed up the hill without stopping.

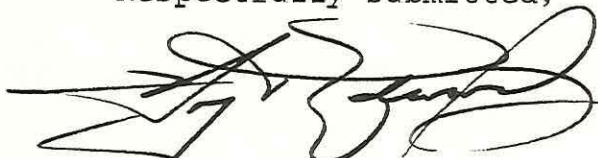
20. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and done.
