

MARCH 13, 1972 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Feb. 28 meeting read and approved.
3. Mayor Dickinson, noting the presence of Mrs. F. D. (Juanita) Hunt and her brother, Max Payne, asked if any alderman wished to offer a motion to grant Mrs. Hunt a package malt beverage license at a N. Wall St. address. Ald. Collins moved to grant the license but failed to get a second to his motion, so the mayor declared it no motion.
4. Supt. Owens said the owners of Gordon Hills Shopping Center had suggested closing the south end of Victory Drive after they purchased the last two houses on the west side of the street. After discussion, Ald. Padgett moved to grant the shopping center owners 30 days in which to start construction to correct the dangerous condition now existing there. Ald. Cox seconded the motion and it was voted on and approved.
5. The following bids were opened on the old reservoir lot: Don O. "Billy" Lewis, \$3,501.50; James S. Owens, \$3,051.00; Edwin Ray Talley, \$3,011.50; Richard T. Carr, \$2,770.00, Roy M. Fox, \$2,450 and J. C. Kay, \$1,151.00. Ald. Padgett moved to accept the high bid, 2nd by Ald. Cox with Ald. Collins voting to sell and Ald. David opposing the sale.
6. Ald. David heard in regard to extension of the runway at Tom B. David Field.
7. Supt. Owens advised that the 12" water main on S. River St. will have to be extended to supply adequate water to fill the new reservoir at Oothcaloga Hts.
8. Mayor Dickinson announced that the juvenile intake worker formerly employed jointly by the counties of Gordon and Bartow and the cities of Calhoun and Cartersville is now a full time employee of Bartow County. Ald. Cox said that the city and county could get a man for approximately \$200 per year over the amount paid last year for the part time man.
9. Ald. David moved to name the new waste water treatment facility the "Oostanaula River Water Pollution Control Plant". Ald. Padgett seconded and the motion was voted on and passed.
10. Asst. Supt. Fox said some firms are dumping latex in the sanitary landfill and he asked approval to try a new chemical at a cost of approximately \$50 which is reputed to dissolve the latex. Council approved.
11. Several water taps were approved on motion of Ald. Padgett and Ald. David.
12. Clerk read the petitions for annexation of Henry Cornwell, Clara Woodring (Cherokee Drive) and Hilda Moss (Red Bud Road). The property was accepted following motion of Ald. David and Padgett.
13. Ald. Padgett moved to adjourn; 2nd by Ald. David and done.
