


APRIL 13, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance read the 104th Psalm and opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of the March 23 meeting were read and approved.
3. Ald. Woods said the correct figure for the first phase of the improvements to the electrical system is \$345,000.00 rather than the \$77,000.00 quoted at the last meeting.
4. Frank Stephens requested annexation of his wife's property on either side of Windsor Drive in Devonwood S/D. Asst. Supt. Roy Fox reminded Mr. Stephens that he had agreed to the annexation of this property in the fall of 1968.
5. Ald. David reported that Mr. W. A. Shirley was still interested in the extension of King St. from Line St. north to Parkland.
6. Ald. David's proposed ordinance on fall-out protection tabled until the April 27 meeting.
7. Ald. David heard in regard to lighting little league baseball field for the recreation commission. Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell said he did not have adequate personnel to do this without omitting other necessary work. Council did not authorize this lighting.
8. Ald. Woods moved that sewer taps be increased from \$50.00 to \$100.00 effective April 14 and that water minimums follow this schedule, effective with bills due May 10: 3/4"-\$3.50 inside and \$4.50 outside the city (same as at present); 1"-\$5.00 and \$6.00; 2"-\$8.00 & \$10.00; 4"-\$30.00 & \$35.00; 6"-\$50.00 & \$60.00; 8"-\$75.00 & \$85.00; 10"-\$90.00 & \$100.00. Ald. Cox seconded and the motion was approved.
9. Ald. Woods moved to send Water & Light Supt. Bell and M. J. West to the electric meter school at Gainesville, Fla. from April 27 thru May 1. Ald. Holland seconded and the motion was approved.
10. Council authorized the placing of a stop sign at the intersection of Hicks St. & Park Ave. on motion of Ald. Cox, 2nd of Ald. Holland.
11. Ald. Holland suggested that the Wall St. Investment Corporation be notified by certified mail that they must take remedial action immediately to prevent further erosion of the embankment between their property and Victory Drive. Council agreed.
12. Supt. Owens heard in regard to financing the improvements to the electric system. Ald. David said the various methods would have to be explored.
13. Supt. Owens announced that bids on the two million gallon stand-pipe for Oothcaloga Heights will be opened on Tuesday, April 14 at 2 PM at the City Hall.
14. Ald. David advised that a group of local people was negotiating with Will Dew for the purchase of his property. Mr. David stated that the city should consider the acquisition of the big spring and possibly 100 acres of land.
15. Ald. David moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. Woods and done.
