

JULY 27, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance introduced Rev. Jim Brooks, pastor of New Echota Methodist Church, who delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of July 13 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. Woods moved the adoption of an ordinance (see opposite page) providing for an election to be held on Sept. 9 to determine if the city shall issue \$400,000.00 in electric system revenue certificates to finance improvements to the electric distribution system. Ald. David seconded and the motion was approved. Council named Hoyt Edwards to superintend the election with William S. Autry and Mrs. Charles F. Giddens as poll officers.
4. After discussion with E. C. Pate, Donald Hollingsworth and J. J. McBee, Council instructed Asst. Supt. Roy Fox to contact the city's consulting engineers as to the feasibility of extending the sanitary sewer main to the motels of the aforementioned gentlemen.
5. Asst. Supt. Fox and J. C. Boyd, executive director of the housing authority, presented plans and specifications for a proposed addition to the authority's facilities. Council declined to approve the plans until Water & Light Supt. Bell and Building Inspector Bowman have an opportunity to study and approve them. Mayor Dickinson agreed to call a special meeting if Mr. Bell and Mr. Bowman OK the plans prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting.
6. Darrel Jones, representing the Calhoun Housing Development Co., asked Council for a clarification of its position in regard to extending sanitary sewer service to the CHD property. Ald. Woods moved that the action taken in this regard on May 25, item 8, be repealed. Ald. Holland seconded and the motion was approved.
7. Ald. Woods reported that property owners at College and Chandler Sts. had agreed to permit the city to trim the trees at this intersection to eliminate a hazard to motorists.
8. Ald. Woods heard in the matter of memorial stones in Fain Cemetery being chipped by mowers. Asst. Supt. Fox said he would see if they might be repaired.
9. Ald. Woods advised that the old Dyar house was being occupied by undesirable characters without the owner's knowledge or consent. Mayor Dickinson instructed Mr. Fox to contact Mrs. J. M. Veach and advise her that this house must be removed.
10. Ald. Woods said that Billy Lewis had inquired as to the date sanitary sewer service will be available on Louise Avenue.
11. Ald. David agreed to Mayor Dickinson's request to withhold discussion of the old Stephens School until the Aug. 10 meeting.
12. Ald. Cox reported that residents of Hunt Drive had requested installation of speed limit signs on this street. St. Supt. Kirby to handle.
13. Water & Light Supt. Bell gave a progress report on the electric system improvements.
14. W & L Supt. Bell suggested that the minimum water charge on Love Bridge Rd. be reduced to \$4.50 per month. Council approved on

motion of Ald. Woods and second of Ald. Holland.

15. Ald. Woods moved that residents east of Resaca be relieved of their water bills due Aug. 10 since the service has been so poor recently. Seconded by Ald. David and approved.


16. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
