



SEPT. 14, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of Aug. 24 meeting read and approved.
3. Mayor Dickinson expressed his appreciation to Ald. Woods, Chairman of the Water & Light Committee, Jack Bell, W & L Supt. and others who worked overtime in an effort to restore water service after lightning knocked out the raw water pumps. Supt. Bell requested and Council approved extra pay for Bldg. Insp. Bruce Bowman for his assistance during the weekend.
4. Ald. Holland reported that the city's retirement committee had met and he had asked Robert L. Collins, Jr., trust officer of the Calhoun First National Bank to submit a proposal.
5. Mayor Dickinson asked Ald. Holland and W & L Supt. Bell to order Christmas decorations for the Shopping Center.
6. Council discussed participating with Gordon County, the City of Cartersville, Bartow County and the federal government in the employing of a "Juvenile Intake Worker" for the Cherokee Judicial Circuit. Ald. Holland moved that the city enter into a contract with the aforementioned agencies for one year. Ald. Cox seconded and the motion was approved.
7. Mayor Dickinson opened the bids on a 1971 police cruiser-Prater Ford bid \$3,459.00 and Roy Davis Chevrolet-Olds bid \$3,454.00. Ald. Cox moved to accept the low bid, Chevrolet, 2nd by Ald. Holland with the stipulation that delivery must be effected by Nov. 1, 1970 or new bids will be taken.
8. Council discussed acts of vandalism that have recently occurred in Chandler Cemetery. Police Dept. to investigate.
9. Ald. Woods said he had received complaints of speeding and excessive noise from an auto with a racing engine on Sherwood Dr.
10. Ald. David heard in regard to increasing the filtering capacity of the water plant. Supt. Owens advised that he would have a progress report on this at the next meeting.
11. Ald. David announced that he would still like to get a roof installed on the old Stephens School building. Supt. Owens to get an estimate of cost from a local builder.
12. Supt. Owens reported that E. V. Blackstock had asked for relief from what he considers excessive water bills for the four mobile homes he rents on Hines Hill. Council ruled that the practice of charging according to meter readings must be adhered to.
13. Council unanimously adopted the resolution approving the issuance of \$400,000.00 in Electric Revenue Bonds.
14. Asst. Supt. Fox advised that two of the two-way radios now in use will have to be replaced to comply with FCC regulations.
15. Asst. Supt. Fox said that the county tax assessors had requested Council's cooperation in eliminating confusion when property is annexed to the city. Council agreed that property annexed after Jan. 1 each year would not be subject to city taxes until the year following such annexation.
16. Ald. Woods moved that the 1970 tax rate be set at 18 mills (18.00 per \$1,000), 2nd by Ald. David and approved.
17. Ald. Cox, at the request of Bldg. Inspector Bowman, moved the adoption of an amendment to the Southern Standard Plumbing Code permitting the use of PVC and ABS pipe for drains, vents and waste. Ald. David 2nd and the motion was approved.
18. Ald. Woods moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. David and done.
