

APRIL 27, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the April 13 meeting read and approved.
3. Recreation Comm. Chairman Edna Langford asked for an increase in the commission's monthly allotment in order to grant salary increases. Ald. David moved that the commission be given an additional \$300.00 per month or \$1,250.00, retroactive to April 1, 1970. Ald. Holland seconded and the motion was voted on and passed. Ald. Woods moved to re-appoint Buford Chitwood to a second five year term on the recreation commission, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
4. Wallace Burton and Howard Robinson asked for a larger storm sewer to keep surface water from draining across their property. Supt. Owens to check and report on this.
5. Ald. Holland suggested that the city continue to plan for a 50 foot street right of way between Crown Craft and the property of Drs. Purcell and Thompson.
6. Ald. Woods reported that Gerald Hite, E. Line St., was having trouble with his septic tank and/or drain field. The matter was discussed, but no action taken.
7. Supt. Owens said Frank Stephens had requested extension of the sanitary sewer some 900 ft. on Windsor Drive prior to the paving of the street. Ald. Woods suggested Supt. Owens ascertain when Mr. Stephens must have this service.
8. Supt. Owens advised that, at the April 14 meeting in Atlanta with Georgia Power officials, attended by Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell and the city clerk, the city's engineers (Southeastern Consulting Engineers) were told that the company will not continue, indefinitely, to serve both 12 KV and 4 KV power loads at station number two. Southeastern considered, in detail, three methods of complying with the company's conditions and recommended a step-down transformer bank at an estimated cost of \$358,750.00. Ald. Woods moved that the proposal be accepted, Ald. David seconded and the motion was approved.
9. Asst. Supt. Fox announced that the new sanitary sewer was placed in service today.
10. City School Board Chairman Beverly Langford asked Council to remove rocks and cut weeds on East Side Elementary School playground. Mayor Dickinson instructed Supt. Owens to ask School Supt. Cate to advise in cleaning the grounds.
11. Asst. Supt. Fox said there was illegal parking on both sides of Piedmont St. and on the east side of S. Wall at Hicks.
12. Ald. Holland suggested awaiting completion of construction on Oothcaloga St. prior to paving of sidewalk on Court St.
13. Ald. Cox asked Chief Roberts to explain his plan to collect fees on the intoximeter. The chief said most courts added \$3 to the fines and distributed this among the policemen qualified to administer the test. He estimated this would amount to \$100 annually for each of his 6 men who give the tests.
14. Clerk asked for an adequate flag pole to be erected in front of city hall. Mayor ordered this done.
15. Clerk said Water & Light Supt. Bell, who is attending electric meter school at Univ. of Florida, had requested Council to advise him as to plans for furnishing adequate water to Conasauga Heights S/D east of Resaca. No further taps to be made until further notice by the Council.
16. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
