

DEC. 14, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Nov. 23 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. Cox moved to grant Don O. "Billy" Lewis a retail malt beverage license for Troy's Grill, 344 S. Wall St., 2nd by Ald. David and unanimously approved.
4. Ald. Holland said he had been asked by James G. Holland if the city would assist him in opening a street from Richards St. to Oak St. Council agreed that he would have to adhere to city policy, i. e., he will have to bear the expense of cutting and paving the street and then, the city will maintain it.
5. Ald. Woods heard in regard to parking on S. Piedmont St. in front of Dave Miller's apartment house and a truck parking on the sidewalk on the west side of College St. Police Dept. to stop the truck parking on the sidewalk, but no solution offered to the parking on S. Piedmont. Mr. Woods asked that a security light be installed at the National Guard Armory.
6. Ald. David requested mercury vapor street lights to replace the incandescent lamps on Woodland Ave.
7. Supt. Owens advised that action should be taken immediately to procure water from the spring at Dew's Pond. He stated that the developers of the property had agreed to permit the city to use one million gallons per day and estimated the cost of extending the main to the spring at \$16,000.00. Ald. David moved to proceed provided Hanover Properties will agree to let the city have two million gpd, 2nd by Ald. Woods and passed.
8. The clerk announced the results of the City Election of Dec. 9: For alderman: Tom B. David, 313 votes, Ted Collins, 273 votes in the race to succeed Ald. David and to succeed Ald. John T. Woods, Jr.- Billy Padgett received 211 votes, Dorothy Rich-76, Jerry J. Smith-112 and Mr. Woods - 224 necessitating a runoff between Ald. Woods and Mr. Padgett on Dec. 23. For the City Board of Education, Richard T. Carr re-elected without opposition and 461 votes. Glenn Elder beat Jack Callahan, 359 to 176 and Ray Weddle won over Sam Thomas, 267 to 217.
9. Bids were let on Nov. 24 on the sewage treatment plant construction with Indian River Construction Co., Inc. of Jacksonville, Fla. the apparent low bidder at \$2,707,713.00. Following a called meeting on Dec. 7 and the recommendation of Bill Greene, the city's consulting engineer, Indian River was awarded the contract at the corrected figure of \$2,709,712.80.
10. Petitions for annexation of Michelle Tufting, Hood Oil, Zeb J. Thompson, Modern Maid Homes and David Chattam read and all parcels annexed following motion of Ald. Cox, 2nd of Ald. Holland.
11. Council ordered City Hall closed on Friday and Sat., Dec. 25-6.
12. Water & Light Supt. Bell advised that his department needed a pickup truck, a chassis for a line truck and a chassis for a ladder truck. Council agreed to accept bids next meeting night.

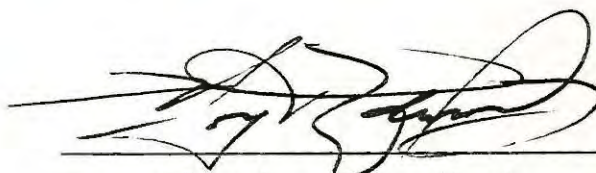
13. On motion of Ald. Woods, 2nd of Ald. Holland, Council adopted the resolution of the Power Section of the Ga. Municipal Ass'n. whereby the city agrees to pay its pro rata share of the cost of opposing the proposed rate increase of the Ga. Power Co.
14. W & L Supt. Bell requested Council to seriously consider relieving him of the responsibility of supervising the water and sewer departments.
15. Ald. David moved to adjourn, Ald. Woods seconded and the meeting was adjourned.
