


SEPT. 28, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Sept. 14 meeting read and approved.
3. Howard Robinson and Wallace Burton complained that surface water runs through their yards during and following rains of any consequence. After discussion, Council advised that the ditch along Woodland Drive will be cleaned out.
4. Several city employees were present and Supt. Owens explained that some of the men have been dissatisfied since learning of a recent wage increase granted two employees in the electric department. Mayor Dickinson suggested that the committee chairmen and the clerk work out an equitable solution.
5. Council discussed the city's financial situation and the forthcoming Water & Sewer Revenue Bond Issue of \$1,500,000.00.
6. Ald. David heard in the matter of using a portion of the new landfill property for a pistol range for local law enforcement officers.
7. Ald. Cox reported that Ellis Avery, a resident of Riverview Dr., had complained of inadequate water pressure. Council discussed improving this service and Water & Light Supt. Bell suggested that the sanitary sewers be replaced at the same time the water mains are enlarged since several residents are not now served.
8. Ald. Holland inquired as to status of Oothcaloga St. project (SR 53 Spur). Supt. Owens advised that, although he had received no official word from the highway department, he had heard that the department hoped to include this project in the October bid letting.
9. Supt. Owens said that Billy Burdette, of the Raymond King Co., was of the opinion that the old Stephens School building can be replaced more economically than it can be placed in good repair.
10. Supt. Owens announced that we now have an adequate water supply for all our customers.
11. Asst. Supt. Fox stated that Mr. Crawford, manager of the Cherokee Nursing Home, had talked with him about annexing the nursing home to the city, but wished to continue to use the oxidation pond rather than connect to the city's sanitary sewer. No action.
12. Mr. Fox reported that David Chattam still wishes to annex his property on Yarborough St. No action taken.
13. Asst. Supt. Fox recommended purchasing tool boxes to house the two-way radios on the pickup trucks to reduce repair costs to the radios. Ald. Woods moved to purchase as needed.
14. W & L Supt. Bell advised that the Christmas decorations for the Shopping Center have been ordered and the merchants there are raising \$500 to augment the city's purchase.
15. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
