


NOV. 23, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the regular meeting of Nov. 9 and the called meeting of Nov. 19 read and approved.
3. Council instructed Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell to perform, at his earliest convenience, the electrical work requested by the Gordon County Training Center for Retarded Children.
4. Ald. Holland moved that the business license ordinance be amended as follows: Vending machine operators from \$25.00 to \$50.00, life insurance companies from a flat fee of \$25.00 to 1% of gross revenue, professional men from \$15.00 to \$50.00, telephone companies from \$250.00 to \$1,500.00 and motels from \$25.00 to 1-10 units, \$25.00, 11-25 units - \$50.00, 26-50 units - \$75.00 and over 50 units - \$100.00. Ald. David seconded the motion and, at the request of Mayor Dickinson, the following amendment was accepted: Beer retailers from \$200.00 to \$500.00. Ald. Holland stated that the provision of the ordinance pertaining to inventories should be rigidly enforced. The motion was then approved by Council.
5. Ald. Woods advised that Chief Water Plant Operator Hugh Perry is confined to Gordon Hospital following a heart attack.
6. Ald. Woods moved that all city employees be given the same bonus for Christmas as in 1969, i.e., \$50.00 for hourly, \$70.00 for salaried employees and 1/4 of 1 month's pay for department heads. 2nd by Ald. David and approved.
7. Mayor Dickinson said there seemed to be some misunderstanding in regard to a recent fire that destroyed Pine Log School in Bartow County. The mayor stated that the City of Calhoun received no official request to respond and therefore, did not respond.
8. Asst. Supt. Fox reported that the contractor installing the sewer main to Industrial Boulevard is apparently in no hurry to complete the project. Council instructed Mr. Fox to institute whatever action deemed necessary to expedite completion of this work.
9. Council agreed to permit Jack C. Knight, dba Jack's Package Store, to re-open his business on the same site, destroyed by fire, in a temporary building.
10. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
