

AUG. 10, 1970 - REGULAR MEETING CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON, ALD. DAVID, HOLLAND AND WOODS PRESENT, ALD. COX ABSENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the July 27 meeting read and approved.
3. Mr. E. C. Pate was advised by Supt. Owens that the city's engineers had done some work on the proposed sewer line to his and Donald Hollingsworth and J. J. McBee's motels.
4. Ald. Woods moved that Modern Maid Homes be required to pay \$25,000.00 to the city for extension of a sanitary sewer main to the property now held by the Calhoun Housing Development Corp. and that the city reimburse Modern Maid \$500.00 for each tap to a maximum of 50 taps, provided the property is annexed to the city and provided further that the sewer main shall be controlled by the city. Ald. David seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.
5. Council discussed the sanitary sewer problem of Piggly Wiggly supermarket in the Gordon Hills Shopping Center, but all agreed that this matter addresses itself to the owners of the shopping center.
6. Ald. David said Buford Chitwood had requested the city to extend water service to his farm.
7. Ald. David reported that Ford Davis, owner of Amakanata, could not help the city since his water supply is inadequate.
8. Council discussed increasing the size of the pump at the old water plant and the possibility of securing water from the large spring at Dew's Pond.
9. Ald. David asked that old Stephens School building be re-roofed; discussed, but no action taken.
10. Ald. Woods moved that the city enter into an agreement with Buford Chitwood, owner of C & S Laundry, to purchase a pump to be installed on US 41 N to provide additional water to Resaca. 2nd by Ald. David and approved.
11. Ald. Woods suggested that Adair St. and environs needed a larger water main. Supt. Owens said the best way to increase water volume to this area is to lay a 6" main from the 8" main at S. Wall & May Sts.
12. Ald. Woods recommended the opening of Block CC in Fain Cemetery on Jan. 1, 1971 without paving and curbing the street between this section and Block BB.
13. Ald. Woods said he would contact Max Hilley, Veterans Service Officer, to determine if the government might replace the footstone at Billy Godfrey's grave. Supt. Owens said that to avoid chipping foot stones with mowers, they should be placed flush with the surface of the ground.
14. Supt. Owens reported that the water supply is critically short and laundries will probably be asked to alternate cutting one shift to reduce consumption.



- 15. Clerk advised that half of the state grant had been received with the balance due about January 1, 1971 because of the census.
- 16. The property of Robert L. Collins, Jr. and Collins Petroleum was annexed by petition following motion of Ald. Woods and second of Ald. Holland.
- 17. Mayor Dickinson excused himself so that Mayor Pro-tem David could preside in hearing the appeal of Billy L. Allen's case number 551, dated July 23, 1970, in which Allen was adjudged guilty as charged of reckless conduct with a motor vehicle and running a red light and fined \$28.00. Council upheld the verdict of Mayor Dickinson in Recorder's Court.
- 18. Ald. Woods and Ald. Holland instructed the clerk to collect all past due taxes due the city.
- 19. Ald. Woods moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. Holland and done.
