

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance had as his guest the Rev. Jerome Hamm, pastor of Nellie Peters Memorial Methodist Church, who presented an interesting lecture on government as referred to in the Bible and opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of the Sept. 12 meeting read and approved.
3. City School Supt. Gus Cate told Council of plans to construct an area vocational trade school here for high school juniors and seniors. No local money would be needed for the physical plant and equipment, but approximately \$30,000 annually would be required of the city and county. Mr. Cate said the Gordon Co. Bd. of Education had agreed to contribute half of this and he asked the Council to assure the City Bd. the City would underwrite the remainder. Ald. King made the motion to guarantee maintenance and operation money of approximately \$15,000. Ald. David seconded and the motion passed.
4. Ald. Woods said Mr. Paul Shoffner had complained of inadequate water volume and pressure at his residence on College St. Supt. Owens said the trouble must be in Mr. Shoffner's service line, but he would check it.
5. Ald. Woods reported that J. D. Anderson, Jr., dba Anderson Food Center, had asked the Council to use its influence in an effort to re-route SR 53 to avoid his store. Consensus opinion was any pressure to change the route might result in abandonment of the project.
6. Ald. Woods moved the adoption of the attached resolution in support of the L & N Railroad Co. Ald. David seconded and the motion was voted on and passed.
7. Ald. David said the Boy Scout Hike-o-rama was coming up this week-end and asked and received permission to get a small quantity of water from the fire plug across the street.
8. Calhoun QB Club Captain Jimmy Tamplin reminded Council by letter of the need for a flag pole at the football field, Ald. King moved to install this, Ald. David 2nd and approved.
9. Letter from GMA advising of the meeting in Rome, Sept. 30 of the special legislative comm. to hear municipalities' monetary needs. Clerk to attend.
10. City's group insurance program discussed and Ald. King suggested that the city become self-carriers. Mayor Dickinson appointed a committee of Ald. King and Ald. David to explore this.
11. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. King and done.
