

JUNE 27, 1966 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT

1. Rev. Fred Hill, pastor of the Presbyterian Church, delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the June 13 meeting read and approved.
3. Robert F. Acree, present in regard to his property which has been condemned by the city, admitted his negligence and said he was not aware the city required building permits. Mr. Acree stated that he knew the city had been trying for about five years to get him to repair or remove his substandard bldgs. and offered no excuse for not having done so. He asked Council for 30 days in which to bring the property within bldg. code requirements. Ald. King recommended the city adhere to its original plans to demolish the bldg. at Park Ave. & Hicks St. and the house at Oothcaloga & Fair Sts. since Mr. Acree has had ample time in which to comply with the city's requirements. Mr. Acree said he could complete necessary repairs to the two houses on Court St. within 30 days. Supt. Owens warned Mr. Acree that these houses could not be repaired so as to meet code requirements. Ald. David made a motion, 2nd by Ald. Woods, to allow Mr. Acree 30 days to remove the Park Ave & Hicks St. bldg. and the house at Oothcaloga & Fair Sts. and bring his other properties to minimum bldg. code standards. Ald. King offered an amendment to the motion giving Mr. Acree 30 calendar days to do this work according to the code and failing therein, the city would demolish the sub-standard property without further notice to Mr. Acree. The amendment was accepted and the motion unanimously passed. Mayor Dickinson then asked Mr. Acree if he understood the motion. He replied that he did.
4. Ald. Woods expressed his pleasure over the manner in which the firemen have conducted their inspections of places of business and offices and thanked the police dept. for keeping his house under close surveillance while he and Mrs. Woods were attending the Ga. Municipal Assn. convention in Columbus recently. Ald. Woods asked if the L & N RR had been contacted for permission to cross their right of way to extend water to John W. Jones. Clerk promised to look into this.
5. Ald. David made a motion to extend the proposed 3600 ft. runway at Tom B. David Field 500 additional feet including taxi way at a cost to the city of \$9,217.50. (The county would pay \$9,217.50, the state \$25,000.00 and the federal gov't \$43,435.) Ald. Norton seconded and the Council stipulated that all the above named agencies must participate in the amounts specified or the motion would be declared invalid. The motion was then voted on and passed.
6. Ald. Norton said the trees in front of Dr. J. E. Billings' residence should be trimmed since some of the limbs are trimmed.
7. Ald. David moved and Ald. King seconded to send two men to a Radiological Monitors' Course in Atlanta, July 11-15. The motion was voted on and passed.
8. Ald. King moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
