

APRIL 25, 1966 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCEL WITH ALL PRESENT  
EXCEPT ALD. W. R. NORTON

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of meeting of April 11 read and approved.
3. Mayor Dickinson excused himself and Mayor Pro-Tem Jerry King presided during the hearing of an appeal by Richard D. Jordon on Cases 196 and 197 on April 16, 1966 from the Recorder's Court. Officer John N. Crowe, Jr. testified that Mr. Jordon staggered upon leaving Belmont Grill as he approached his car, and that he was arrested after driving away. Mr. Jordon denied that he staggered and stated that he was illegally arrested as Belmont Grill and that portion of S. Wall St. (US 41, SR 3) in front of and south of said place of business is outside the corporate limits of the City of Calhoun. The court reminded Mr. Jordon that, even if his contention was true, the officers had a legal right to make a citizens arrest, and after hearing the testimony of Gordon Co. Deputy Sheriff Charles L. Ellis and Police Sgt. Claude E. Allen corroborating Officer Crowe's statement, upheld and affirmed the decision of Mayor Dickinson in Recorder's Court.
4. Ald. David said an additional \$5,500.00 was needed in the airport account for the purchase of land and approach easement from Miss Mary Johnson. Mr. David made a motion to borrow this amount on a 5% demand note. Ald. King seconded and the motion was voted on and passed.
5. Ald. King moved to send three policemen to a seminar for law enforcement officers in Cartersville the week of May 2. Ald. David seconded and the motion passed.
6. Mayor Dickinson said he had received complaints from residents on the west side of town of barking dogs keeping them awake at night. Chief Roberts said some of the complainants had dogs themselves. Ald. King stated that it was about the time of the year when the city destroyed stray dogs and the council agreed and ordered notice published in the local papers that beginning May 16 this would be done.
7. Mayor Dickinson read letters from the Jr. Hi PTA and the Kiwanis Club requesting the city to enforce the laws regarding under age operators of motor vehicles. Council ordered notice published that the city police dept. would arrest violators after May 15, '66.
8. Supt. Owens reported that the Ga. Historical Comm. was interested in having city water extended to New Echota. Mr. Owens said the main would have to be extended some 1300 ft. at a cost of \$2800. Council agreed to absorb half the cost if the comm. would pay half.
9. Supt. Owens said 7 customers could be added on the Dew's Pond Rd. by extending the 6" main some 2,000 ft. Council asked Mr. Owens to check this and report his findings at the next meeting.
10. Ald. Woods asked about the fill at Chandler Cemetery. Mr. Owens advised that more dirt would be placed in the fill. Mr. Owens told Council that the entrance to the cemetery was now locked at night.
11. Supt. Owens reported that he had been assured by Mr. Bill Greene, of Wiedeman-Singleton, that the city's application for sewage treatment plant would be filed prior to the May 15 deadline.
12. The clerk advised of the application of Paul G. Lusk and Carl E. Blackmon to operate a pool room in the south half of the Echota Drive In bldg. Ald. King moved to grant this licens@, Ald. David seconded and council approved.
13. Ald. King moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
