

City Council met in regular session, the following members present, Mayor Harry Lawrence, Tom B. David, Hoyt Edwards, and Calvin Caldwell.

Mayor Lawrence called the meeting to order and led in prayer, after which the following business was conducted:

1. Minutes of last meeting read, corrected and approved.
2. Mr. Spink present, and heard in regard to resolution from Gordon County Hospital committee, asking that the city give hospital same light rate as city schools, explaining that hospital was operating at a loss and any help would be greatly appreciated. Mr. David made motion that this request be granted, but upon further discussion was decided that action be tabled until next meeting, as the city went to considerable expense in building this line. Mr. Spink states he will report at next meeting to find out outcome.
3. James Baugh present with delegation from West Side. Several heard stating that the Baugh Cafe was a nice, orderly place and no knowledge of any beer being sold on Sundays or being brought from Rome by the Doziers. James Baugh states that he is sole owner and hires the Dozier woman temporarily, and assures council that he will personally run the place as soon as his present employer can secure someone to take his place. Mr. Edwards asked Baugh if he thought he could get clear by the first of February. Mayor Lawrence asked that he sever relations with the Doziers. Mr. Caldwell requested that Baugh's license be recalled until he gets his place in line. Mr. David requests that as the colored people need a nice place to eat and serve beer, that Baugh be allowed to remain open if he gets his place in order and arranges to run it himself.
4. Mr. Edwards heard in regard to Young Adult Athletic room in Civic Center building. After discussion it was decided to wait until building was renovated before trying to decide on what divisions would be made.
5. Mr. Edwards heard in regard to steam pipe in Jail being in such condition that heat could not be turned on. Earl Champion to fix this.
6. Mr. Edwards heard in regard to sidewalk being broken where Colonial store trucks unload. Also open Garbage Cans and trash all over street. Mayor Lawrence advises he will take care of this personally.
7. Mr. Edwards in regard to Garbage truck being seen in Fox subdivision outside city limits. Mr. McDaniel to investigate.
8. Mr. Edwards in regard to dimes from Parking meters for March of Dimes. Mr. Caldwell made motion to donate as had been previously done, seconded by Mr. Edwards, voted on and passed.
9. Mr. Caldwell heard in regard to City Attorney. Makes motion to appoint Mr. John Gregory to fill Mr. Tommie Pope's place. Seconded by Mr. Edwards, voted on and passed.
10. Mr. Caldwell in regard to uniform for New fireman. City to furnish whatever need for first outfit.
11. Mr. David heard in regard to Projector and stand for Civilian Defense program at a price of \$ 256.47. This to be used in training Policemen and Firemen and aid in first aid service, etc. Mr. Caldwell makes motion to buy this projector, Seconded by Mr. David, voted on and passed.
12. Mr. David in regard to 2-Way radio. States this has not yet received Federal Okay.
13. Mayor Lawrence heard in regard to renovation of Civic Center. Mr. Hooper to be in charge of inside arrangements. Mr. David to get figures on outside changes and report to special meeting at 5:30 Thursday afternoon.

14. Mr. Edwards heard in regard to Raymond Bagwell water bill. Mr. Caldwell made motion that this meter be charged as two minimums as long as it was connected to two houses, Seconded by Mr. Edwards, voted on and passed. Mr. David not voting.

No other business, Mr. David made motion to adjourn, Seconded By Mr. Caldwell, voted on and passed.
