City Council met in regular session at the City Hall At 7:30 Pm

Alderman Woods and Alderman David were absent from the meeting.

Mr. A. B. Elizer pastor of the First Methodist Church opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and adopted by the council.

Mr. Pat Patterson was present in regard to a new group insurance plan but since Mr. David and Mr. Woods were out of town there was no action taken.

Mr. J.M. Muse and a delegation from the Town of Sugar Valley were present to continue the discussion about running water to their community. Mr. McDaniel reported that he had talked with Mr. Lex Jolley of The Robinson-Humphrey Company about the line to Sugar Valley and that Mr. Jolley stated his bonding company would lend the City of Calhoun \$75,000.00 for 25 years at 5% interest on the present information of 90 customers at \$3.50 minimum and a guarantee of \$150.00 per month from the J.M. MUSE Corp. which would be attached to the last water certificate issue. After discussion Mr. Edwards made a motion that the water line be extended to the Town of Sugar Valley if the cost would be \$75,000.00 or less for building the line and the money could be obtained from the bonding company. This motion seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mr. Ellis Woods and Mr. Marvin Taylor of the Town of Plainville were present to discuss further the possibility of running water to their community. Mr. Taylor reported that they had 143 customers signed from the residence of Alex Franklin to the Town of Plainville and that they figured between 20 to 30 customers from the City of Calhoun to the Alex Franklin Farm. The City was to take care of getting the 20 to 30 customers signed. Mr. McDaniel stated that approximately \$875.00 revenue was needed per month to borrow the \$130,000.00 needed for building the line. Mayor Lawrence stated to the delegation to go back and try to get 10 more customers and he would call a meeting of the council for Friday, July 12, 1957 at 4:30 PM to take action on the proposed line.

Mr. Edwards reported that the people that live on Riverview Drive were complaining about their water pressure being low. Mr. McDaniel stated that the City had a one inch water line on this street and he thought a two inch line would correct the situation. Council agreed to leave the problem to the City Engineer.

Council instructed the Clerk to have the Muffler Ordinance reprinted and instruct the Chief of Police to run an add in the local newspaper advising the public of the contents of the Ordinance.

There being no other business the meeting was adjourned.
