City Council met in regular session with all members present except Alderman Tom David who was away on business.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the clerk and adopted by the council.


Alderman Woods stated that Mr. Jess Rich had contacted him and was ready for his store to be moved. The council instructed the city engineer to contact Mr. Joe Aycock and proceed with the moving of the store on Line Street.

A letter was read to the council thanking them for the use of the third floor at the Civic Center Building. They also requested the use of the back yard for a playground and ask the city to pay up to \$500.00 on covering the third floor. After discussion Mr. Edwards made a motion that the city pay up to \$500.00 on the purchase of material for covering the third floor of the civic center. This motion was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed. After further discussion Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the back yard of the civic center be closed to the public and used for non traffic activities at the civic center and for use by the girl scouts as a playground. This motion was seconded by Mr. Edwards voted on and passed.

Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the city council petition the local representative and senator to introduce a bill in the legislature in January proceeding with the extension of the city limits of the City of Calhoun. This bill would be subject to a vote by the people living inside the city limits of Calhoun and the people living outside the city limits of Calhoun. This motion was seconded by Mr. Woods voted on and passed. Mayor Lawrence stated that he would help draw up the ordinance and the bill.

Mr. McDaniel stated that the water projects to the Town of Sugar Valley and the Town of Plainville were proceeding at a rapid pace. He also stated that Miss Floyd in the Town of Plainville wanted \$500.00 for the proposed site for the standpipe. Council agreed to work out something with the Plainville officials regarding the site.
