City Council met in regular session at the city hall with all members present with the exception of Mayor Harry Lawrence who was out of town on business.

The meeting was opened by prayer by Mayor Pro Tem Hoyt Edwards.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

A delegation from the Sugar Valley Community was present and expressed their desire and appreciation to the council on the progress that was being made toward running water to the Sugar Valley Community. They wanted the council to know that they were interested in the project and stated that they would do everything they could to help with the project. Mayor Pro Tem Edwards explained what had been done and what needed to be done before the project could be considered by the council to be a profitable one. Also that the City would let the people of the community know as the plans progressed.

It was brought before the council the fact that Lee Evans had discontinued his beer business on Park Avenue and was unable to find another location to move his business to. Mr. Evans requested that the City refund a prorata share of his license money. After discussion Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the city rebate Mr. Evans \$150.00 on his licenses and the \$200.00 bond which he had posted. This motion seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. David stated to the council that Sudie Clark wanted the City to do some more work on her house on Line Street. After discussion there was no action taken.

Mr. Edwards stated to the council that Mr. Frank Richardson was still interested in water to his property on the Fairmount Rd. After discussion it was decided that Mr. Richardson would have to buy the 2" line and pay the City for each tap. The city in turn would lay the line at no cost to Mr. Richardson and the line would belong to the city.

There being no other business Mr. Dickinson made a motion to adjourn seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.
