City Council met in regular session at the City Hall with all members present.

Alderman Frank Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and adopted.

At this time the group insurance of the city was taken up for discussion. Mr. David made a motion that the plan of the ~~Lincoln~~ Life Insurance Co. be taken with the approval of the life insurance of Mr. H. B. Owens. This insurance of Mr. Owens was to be checked and see what the best plan would be. This motion voted on and passed.

Food for city prisoners discussed at this time. The mayor instructed the the Police Committee to check into the possibility of getting the county to feed the prisoners.

Mr. Edwards brought before the council the possibility of a 15 minute parking meter to be installed in front of the Bell Telephone Office on South Wall Street. Also a yellow curb in front of the Office was discussed. Mayor Lawrence referred the problem to the street committee.

At this time the council agreed to leave the red light on North Court Street at the entrance to Wall Street on red at all times. Also a motion was made by Mr. David that a sign be placed on North Wall Street at the entrance to Harlan Street designating no left turn to North bound traffic. This motion voted on and passed.

Mr. Edwards made a motion that the mayor be given the authority to sign a License Agreement Ordinance between the City of Calhoun And the Southern Railway System for a pipe line crossing in the Town of Sugar Valley and the Town of Plainville. This motion seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

Mayor Lawrence stated that he would like for the council to give some consideration to placing into force an ordinance requiring the clearing of corners at intersections.

Mr. David made a motion that the granting of a cemetery lot to the widow of the late Jack Nesbitt be reaffirmed. This motion was voted on and passed
↙ Seconded by Mr. Hoyt Edwards.

Mr. McDaniel stated to the council that he and Mr. Bill Greene of the Weidman and Singleton Engineers had made a ~~thorough~~ study of the Plainville and Sugar Valley Communities and thought a two hundred thousand gallon standpipe in Plainville and one hundred thousand gallon standpipe in Sugar Valley would be sufficient to serve these communities. Also stated that the ground work for these projects were taking shape.


Mr. Edwards made a motion that the City of Calhoun give the South Half of lot # 49 to the widow of the late H. E. (Dock) Miller for his devoted service to the City. This being in the Fain Cemetery Addition. This motion seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mayor Lawrence read a petition from the residents of the Hendserson Bend Road requesting water to their community. Seventeen people had signed the petition which was more than the required number for a 2 inch line. Mr. David made a motion that this line be run as soon as the money was available. This motion seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

The possibility of the city purchasing more parking meters was brought up for discussion at this time. Mr. Edwards made a motion that the plan submitted by the Park-O-Meter Company be tabled for the present. Seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.

The council agreed to meet Monday, July 29, to go over the tax assements. There being no other business the council was adjourned.
