

February 11, 1957
Calhoun, Georgia

City Council Met in regular session at 7:30 PM with all members present
Meeting opened with prayer by Chief Hayes.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and adopted.

Mr. Tony Wade and Mr. Jack Throunbrough were present and stated that they were interested in opening a bowling alley and wanted to know how much the licenses would be and what regulations the city would require. Mr. Edwards made a motion that the bowling alley be allowed to operate and would be regulated by an ordinance drawn up by the City. In this ordinance would be: Operating hours from 7 AM until 11PM, Monday through Friday, and 7 AM until 12 PM on Saturday. Sunday from 1 PM until 5:30 PM. The amount of the Licenses would be \$ 75.00 and the place must be kept in an orderly manner at all times. This motion seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

The City Council agreed that Mr. M. C. Dobson or anyone having amusements machines in the city must pay \$ 250.00 licenses fee.

The Council brought Mr. Billy Phillips before the body and explained the pool room ordinance to him and informed Mr. Phillips to carry out the ordinance.

Mr. Edwards stated to the council that he and Mr. Dickinson had visited the home of Miss Ruth Gentry and that her house had been leaking due to the moving by the city and Mr. Edwards stated to the council that he had instructed Mr. Leon Long to fix same.

Mr. David informed the council that he had made a trip to Atlanta to get the City qualified to purchase a fire truck and other war surplus materials. Stated that the City could not use this material in regular line of business that it must be used for Civil Defense purposes. At this time there was no truck available.

Mr. David stated to the council that on Thursday February 14, 1957 at 5:30 Pm the International Harvester Co. would send a Civil Defense Rescue Truck here for demonstration purposes. The demonstration would take place at the Civic Center, Mr. David stated that he planned to ask the American Legion, V. F. W., Jaycees, and Elks to help pay for the truck. Stated that the Federal Government would pay $\frac{1}{2}$ the cost.

Mr. David stated that Mr. Trammel Chitwood wanted the city to extend the water drain in back of his store a distance of 5 ft. Also wanted permission to extend his building back a distance of 5 ft. The council agreed to this since the city did not own the property and suggested that he have an agreement with the adjoining property owners since a window would have to be closed in. Mr. Dickinson made a motion that the city grant him this permission seconded by Mr. David voted on and passed.

Mr. David reported that Col. Young Henderson had a bill from the state for the registration fee for the Calhoun Civic Center corporation. Mayor Lawrence stated that he would look into the matter for the City.

At this time the council voted against allowing an army tank to be brought up the street to be placed in front of the local movie because of possible damage to the streets and water lines.

At this time Mr. Ar R. McDaniel Jr. gave a report on the possible extension of the water lines to Plainville and to Sugar Valley. Mr. McDaniel stated that it was approximately 8.8 miles to plainville and a 6" main would cost approximately \$100,000.00 and there was a potential of 302 customers. To Sugar Valley it was a distance 5.2 miles with a potential of 109 customers at a cost of approximately \$ 60,000.00 Also to Red Bud it was a distance of 7.3 miles with a potential of 107 customers and would cost approximately \$80,000.00 No action taken on the water lines at this time, but instructed Mr. McDaniel to look into the matter further and report back at the next meeting.

The council agreed to lay the water pipe for the property owners on the Fairmount Road if they would buy same and pay for their taps.

Mr. Edwards made a motion to pay the expense of the City Clerk to attend a City Clerk School at the University of Georgia on April 14th and 15th. This motion seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed. There being no other business Mr. David made a motion to adjourn Seconded by Mr. Dickinson voted on and passed.
